








We Stood On The Staff

JUNIOR-SENIOR PROM




The Junior-Senior Prom was given by the Junior Class on May 1, 1959. The theme was "Oriental Gardens" and the gym was decorated accordingly.

Granite Falls eliminated Central 3-0 at Brownton in the first round of Region 3 play. Thus a squad consisting of seven seniors and eight underclassmen closed out a successful season in our national sport.


FINIS
