

ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Alliance is located in the northeast corner of Stark County, approximately 15 miles from downtown Canton on the west and 45 minutes from Akron on the North. The district is primarily urban with easy access to major highways.

The 2,981 students who are enrolled in the Alliance City School District attend school in excellent facilities including one high school, one middle school, one intermediate school, one elementary school, and an Early Learning School that houses preschool, kindergarten and first grade.

An extensive summer program is available to all students. It is offered at Alliance High School and includes non-academics for enrichment. The Early Learning School offers a summer intervention program for preschool students to help prepare them for the beginning of their education.

All Alliance High School students are offered courses of study that will earn full college credits under Ohio's post secondary options. Dual credit courses are available so that students can transfer the courses to a college of their choice. Advanced placement classes and enrichment classes are offered as part of the curriculum to give every child an opportunity to reach his or her fullest potential.

An extensive career technical program is available at the high school, including certified welding, computer design, automotive repair, and building trades.

The Alliance Career Center and the Robert T. White School of Practical Nursing offers adult education to the Alliance community under the guides of the Board of Education.

Support of these programs is demonstrated by the partnership between the Alliance Schools, parents, and the entire community. Local businesses and agencies support educational projects in cooperation with the teaching staff. Alliance is a community united in support of education. The community has a great deal of pride in their school system.

There has been a surge of growth in Alliance with the expansion of both the University of Mount Union and the Alliance Community Hospital. The district has adequate housing that can be purchased at affordable prices. Cost of living in the area is below state and national levels.

Residents are within easy driving time of medical facilities and doctors, institutions of higher learning, recreational opportunities at state and local parks, superior shopping at local malls and the professional Football Hall of Fame.
