<p>Before Reading: (5-7 min.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Book Introduction: (include meaning, structure, visual) This book is called <u>Go Home, Chick!</u> What do you think it will be about? In this book a little chick is lost, and he is looking for his mother. He is wandering around the farm asking other animals if they know where his mother is. They keep telling him to go home. Let's turn to page 2. Where is he looking for his mother here? The page says, "Is my mother here?" asked Chick. Who is he talking to? Yes he is talking to Duck. It says, "Go home, Chick!" said Duck. But Chick doesn't go home, he goes to another animal asking where his mom is. Do you think he will find his mom? Let's take a picture walk to find out who he talks to. We will stop on page 13, so we don't ruin the surprise. Let's read to find out if he finds his mom. Difficult Words/Vocabulary mother (pg 2), here (pg 2), said (pg 3), asked (pg 4), welcome (pg 16) Suggested Teaching Point: (refer to Behaviors to Notice and Support) Readers read from left to right and then sweep to the next sentence. 	
<p>During Reading: (5-10 min.) *Revisit the teaching point as needed.</p> <p>Prompts to Support readers: <i>Does it match? Does it sound right? Does it make sense?</i></p>	
<p>After Reading: (5-7 min.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Discuss the story <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Who is Chick looking for? Who does he talk to help him? Why do they keep telling him to go home? Notice where they are pointing each time they tell him to go home. Why are they doing that? Where did he find his mom? How do you think he felt when he couldn't find her for a long time? How would you have felt? How do you think the chick got lost? Return to Teaching Point Comprehension Strategy Focus: connections, questions, inferences, visualizing, summarizing, synthesizing, determining importance 	
<p>Writing Connection: (5 min.)</p> <p>Where did Chick find his mother? or Who was Chick looking for?</p>
