

# The Frank C. Loennig and Emily Loennig Theodosious

## **The Frank C. Loennig Scholarship**

Given in honor of Frank C. Loennig who attended North Powder and Muddy Creek Schools where he excelled in the study of mathematics and science. He continued to work in mathematics and science in graduate school and later became the head of Georgetown Day High School in Washington D.C. This scholarship is awarded to a member of the graduating senior class who demonstrates an excellence in the study of mathematics and science.

## **Emily Loennig Theodosious Scholarship**

Given in honor of Emily Loennig Theodosious who graduated from Muddy Creek School where she taught at Powder Valley School. She went on to receive the Teacher of the Year Award from the military schools and was the first teacher of Black History in the Oakland Public Schools. This scholarship is awarded to a member of the graduating senior class who demonstrates an excellence in the humanities courses which include English, history, music and art.

## **Scholarship Requirements**

These two \$150 North Powder scholarships are separate and offered by the Loennig family. The recipient may *not* be the valedictorian or salutatorian of the class. The high school faculty will determine the winner of this scholarship. To be considered for these scholarships, students must type a one-page letter describing the student's strengths in the areas of math and science or the humanities, depending upon which scholarship they are applying for. Students must plan to attend a 2-year, 4-year or trade school and describe what their future goals are and how their strengths will be used in their future.

## **Deadline**

Students must have letters submitted to Mrs. Colton by May 20.
