Importance of Accurate Records

COVID-19 cost reimbursements will require careful records, which will be critical for a successful submission. Examples include:

- Cleaning supplies
- Personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Overtime
- Legal bills
- Technology needs
- Unemployment Subs (self-insured)
- Construction change orders, penalties, cost of delays
- Lunch and backpack distribution programs
- Healthcare costs addition of unemployed spouses to policies, COVID-19 claims, increase in claims from delayed procedures
- Cyber-Charter potential for increased enrollments in 20-21
- Changes in delivery of instruction to facilitate software needs and 1:1 instruction

Breakdown of Funding Sources

FEMA Public Assistance Grant Program

This program is available to applicants from states where a major disaster has been declared and is the initial triage for available funding, focused on 'Category B' items, or measures that were taken by the applicant to eliminate imminent threats to lives, health, and safety. During this period, non-state entities can sole-source services. The grant application process can be administered by a Disaster Relief Vendor who acts as your liaison to FEMA.

U.S. Department of Education Stabilization Fund Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (C.A.R.E.S.)

More than \$30 Billion of federal funding is being made available to the states, focused on public K-12 and higher education. Points of interest earmarked for education through this Act include programs to support distance learning, tele-medicine, and broadband; nutritional program support; head start/early education programs; Project-SERV grants to help with cleaning and disinfecting of schools; and Health Department monies for cleaning and disinfecting guidance.

Future Funding

A potential multi-trillion dollar infrastructure funding plan will be geared towards expansion of passenger rail networks, maintenance of airports/ports/harbors, climate resiliency and reduction of greenhouse gas pollution, internet connectivity, road and bridge repairs, and enhancements to electric utility grids.

'Category B' Eligible Costs:

- Costs (labor & supplies) associated with preparing, responding and recovering from the pandemic
- Medical facility services and supplies
- Disinfection of Eligible Public Facilities
- Costs to establish and operate temporary medical facilities
- Medical waste disposal
- Use of specialized medical equipment
- Training on COVID-19 response
- Any measures taken to protect students and staff
- Overtime paid to employees
- Cost of PPE
- Cost of Emergency Contractors
- Costs organization would not typically incur during regular operations
