Before Reading: (5-7 min.)		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Book Introduction: (include meaning, structure, visual) • Fairy Tale – once upon a time, lived happily ever after , royalty, magical creatures • A tale set in medieval times - knights, kings and queens. • A miller’s (grinds grain) daughter is sent to the king to spin straw into gold. A little magical elf-like creature comes to help her, at a price. She promises him her first born son. When she has a son, he returns to claim him. Read to find out what happens... 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Difficult Words/Vocabulary: P. 3 encounter P.21 inquiries P. 18 piteously • Suggested Teaching Point: (refer to Behaviors to Notice and Support) Good readers infer the problem and solution in the story. Good readers infer what lesson the author is trying to teach. 		
During Reading: (5-10 min.) *Revisit the teaching point as needed.		
Prompts to Support readers: <i>Does it match?</i> <i>Does it sound right?</i> <i>Does it make sense?</i>		
After Reading: (5-7 min.)		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss the story <p>Are there any parts of the story you do not understand? Why is this a fairy tale? How did the illustrations add to your understanding of the story? Describe the character traits of the father, daughter, king, and Rumpelstiltskin . How do you think the father felt after his daughter was taken to the king?</p>		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Return to Teaching Point What do you think the problem and solution in the story are? • Comprehension Strategy Focus: connections, questions, inferences, visualizing, summarizing, synthesizing, determining importance <p>Do the pictures help you better understand and enjoy the story? Did you visualize as you read?</p>
