WHEREAS, the Local Unit Technology Pilot Program and Study Act (P.L. 2001, c. 30) (the "Act") authorizes the purchase of electric supply service for public use through the use of an online auction service: and

WHEREAS, Cresskill Public School District will utilize the online auction services of EMEX, LLC, an approved vendor pursuant to the Act, waiver number EMEX LLC-1, located at www.energymarketexchange.com; and

WHEREAS, EMEX, LLC is compensated for all services rendered through the participating supplier that a contract is awarded to; and

WHEREAS, the auction will be conducted pursuant to the Act; and be it

WHEREAS, if the auction achieves a price of \$0.0929/kWh or less for a 12 month term, a price of \$0.0922/kWh or less for 18 month term, or a price of \$0.0925/kWH or less for a 24 month term; Cresskill Public School District may award a contract to the winning supplier for the selected term.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Business Administrator of the Cresskill Public School District be and she hereby is authorized to execute on behalf of the Cresskill Public School District any electricity contract proffered by the participating supplier that submits the winning bid in the EMEX Reverse Auction if the auction achieves a price of \$0.0929/kWh or less for a 12 month term, a price of \$0.0922kWh or less for an 18 month term, or a price of \$0.0925/kWh or less for a 24 month term; Cresskill Public School District may award a contract to the winning supplier for the selected term.
