

March's Choose To Be Nice Value of the Month is Patience and Pria will be helping us learn about what it means to be patient.

In **Preschool**, teachers will read <u>I'll Wait Mr. Panda</u> by Steve Antony and <u>Waiting is Not Easy</u> by Mo Willems.

In **Kindergarten**, teachers will read <u>Leo The Late Bloomer</u> by Robert Kraus. As a class they will make a chart about all of the things we can learn if they are patient.

In **First Grade**, teachers will read <u>The Carrot Seed</u> by Ruth Krauss. As a class they will plant their own seeds and chart the growth of the seeds over time. They will discuss how the seeds grow at different rates and how the students felt when being patient for them to grow.

Delay of Opening

From the Art Room

Our Kindergarten artists were inspired by the read aloud, "Deep Down Underground" and they drew images of what is happening above ground and below. They really enjoyed the process of our collaborative art unit. We reconfigured our classroom, threw on the smocks and worked together to create something beautiful!

Focusing on painting circles or hearts, our artists created huge murals that are currently featured in the library!



First graders created their own "Water Lily Pond" paintings inspired by the work of Claude Monet. They used watercolors to create their pond, tissue paper and construction paper to create lily pads and flowers and finally modeling clay to make some happy pond creatures like frogs, ducks and more! Then they took on a brand new task of Printmaking. This practice is challenging and pushed our artists to persevere after each print. We used foam boards as our printing plates and block printing ink to print onto construction paper.

In Art Exploration, our artists created their own snow, using shaving cream, baking soda and a little white vinegar. We created paintings featuring our snow that were styled after "The Snowy Day" by Ezra Jack Keats. We also worked together to paint a stunning window mural in the front vestibule of our school.


