


A MESSAGE FROM MCPE

- Memorial will expand its library of Jump Rope Readers (decodable books that benefit children
 who struggle with reading) that promote equity, diversity, and inclusion. Through rich
 discussions that will happen while being engaged with Jump Rope Readers, students will
 develop into reflective community individuals at Memorial, in Medfield, and in their future.
- Memorial will purchase a Gaga Ball Pit a much-anticipated and inclusive game that will be
 used by the entire school community. The Memorial PE closet will be updated with new
 shelving and organization supplies, allowing for safe and effective storage of new equipment.
- Memorial will establish a lending library of classroom sensory learning tools for teachers to
 access for students in need. Sensory tools are helpful for all students and provide them with
 opportunities to receive organizing sensory input that will assist with behavioral and
 emotional regulation to support learning throughout the day.
- Wheelock will purchase a Book Vending Machine. Students will have various in-school opportunities to earn tokens to be used in the vending machine to "purchase" chapter and picture books, generating excitement for reading and rewarding positive behavior.
- Wheelock will also purchase an interactive electronic whiteboard for the gymnasium that will allow for technology integration and more engaging lessons in Wellness classes, enhancing student participation and motivation.
- All five Medfield schools will benefit from funding for Mental Health Baskets at nurses' offices
 that will allow our nurses to respond to the increase in the number of student visits for mental
 health concerns. Each nurse's office will be provided with a basket of tools that, after an initial
 assessment, students can use to help manage their stress, anxiety, depression, and other
 mental health issues that may arise during school hours.

Senses
