Spanish 4 (Revised Spring 2020)

Course Description: Spanish 4 emphasizes vocabulary, advanced levels of grammar, writing, translating, and being able to express ideas in conversation. Learning of more conversational phrases.Continued studies of the cultures and political systems of Hispanic countries.

Big Ideas:

- 1. Students are able to confidently understand the Spanish language at a higher proficiency level when spoken to and are able to respond at a higher level in the target language. Increase in vocabulary and grammar to extend ability to converse and write in a variety of topics with confidence. They will be able to better identify unfamiliar words through context.
- 2. Students continue to learn about the Hispanic culture and politics systems. They will learn of the differences within the Hispanic Culture in the various Spanish Speaking countries.
- 3. Cite strong and thorough textual evidence to support analysis of what the text says explicitly as well as inferences drawn from the text, including determining where the text leaves matters uncertain.
- 4. Students continue their mastery of listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. Reading is both intensive and extensive, encompassing all genres, including both newspaper, magazines, and poetry. Readings involve current information, fiction, and emphasize contemporary history and culture.

Essential Learner Objectives:

By the end of this course, the students will be able to:

- 1. Engage in conversation using advanced grammar (verb tenses, conversational phrases, and utilize more vocabulary covering more content, provide and obtain information, continue in expressing feelings, emotions, ideas and exchange opinions about more content areas.
- 2. Understand and interpret written and spoken language on a variety of topics and be able to express in depth, their ideas or concerns at a higher level.
- 3. Be able to write reports/essays in Spanish, Use Spanish skills to proofread written work.
- 4. Point out cognates and false cognates as part of development of the language.
- 5. Be proficient in reading and evaluating fiction, poetry and drama.
- 6. Demonstrate an understanding of the relationship between the practices and perspectives of the Spanish-Speaking culture.
- 7. Demonstrate an understanding of the nature of language through comparisons of the Spanish and English language.
- 8. Justify the importance of knowing a foreign language in today's society. Reinforce and further their knowledge of other disciplines through Spanish.
