College Literature is an elective course designed for college bound juniors and seniors. The course is designed to expose students to a variety of classical literature from various geographical areas and time periods. Critical reading, discussion, and literary analysis is emphasized. Students will write literary essays, research papers, and some creative writings. Students may earn 3.0 hours of college credit through enrollment in ENG1570 Intro to Literature at MAC. Summer reading is required.
