Creative writing is designed to aid students in their creative expression, as well as delivery of one's writing. Students will read and discuss articles on the craft of writing. Students will read and evaluate the effectiveness of fiction and poetry of varying styles. They will write and workshop short stories and poems to complete a final portfolio. Students will be expected to read original work.

PREREQUISITE: Grade of B or above in English I & II and teacher recommendation or approved writing samples.
