## Sixth Grade English/Language Arts 3/2020

**Course Description:** In Sixth Grade ELA we will teach comprehension strategies for literature and informational text, including the use of reciprocal teaching. Listening and speaking skills will be enhanced through whole and small group discussion of literature and nonfiction reading selections and an oral presentation of a research report. We will teach the writing process for different writing tasks while also instructing students in conventions of the English Language.
