## Fifth Grade English/Language Arts (Revised for 2019-2020)

Course Description: In Fifth Grade English/Language Arts, students will read a variety of literary texts: fiction, non-fiction, poetry, and drama. Students will develop vocabulary strategies and word analysis skills. Students will also continue to develop their skills in summarizing, identifying plot and character traits, setting, theme, author's purpose, and main idea and supporting details. Students will learn to recognize and use different types of figurative language including similes, metaphors, and idioms. Fifth-grade students will continue to develop their skills in clear and focused writing and speaking. Writing areas to be addressed in fifth grade will include conventions and the writing process. The student will be able to write for different audiences to inform, describe, entertain and persuade. Speaking areas to be addressed will include formal and informal speaking presentations.

- 1. Reading is essential to build stamina, comprehension skills, and expanding our understanding of the world through learning and enjoyment.
- 2. Writers will publish writing texts of various genres through the effective writing process and conventions of English.
- 3. Speakers will express their ideas clearly to an audience while capturing their attention.
- 4. Listeners determine ideas and opinions through gathering information.
