Third Grade ELA 10/2019

Course Description

Third grade students will read and listen to a variety of fiction and nonfiction texts with emphasis on learning about words, reading text with fluency and expression, and learning comprehension strategies. Students will write narrative, opinion, and informative pieces, of various lengths, with emphasis on grammar, usage, spelling, and mechanics. Formal and informal speaking opportunities will develop oral language skills. Students will transition from manuscript to cursive handwriting.

Big Ideas

- 1. Reading is a means of learning new information and of enjoyment.
- 2. Writing is a means of sharing information and knowledge.
- 3. Oral and written language affects how others perceive us and how we perceive others.
