## First Grade ELA 7/2016

## **Course Description:**

First grade students will identify and describe the following story elements: characters, setting, plot, main idea and key details. They will learn and use phonic skills to decode and spell words. Also, they will read on-level text with purpose, understanding, accuracy, and appropriate rate. First grade students will learn about the following 4 styles of writing: opinion, informative, how-to, and narrative. By the end of the year, these writings will include a topic sentence, 3 details, and closing sentence. First grade students will learn conventions of standard English grammar and use them when writing and speaking.

## Big Ideas:

- 1. Words are made up of letters and sounds.
- 2. When we read aloud it should sound smooth, like someone is talking.
- 3. Good readers identify and describe story elements.
- 4. Reading books gives us information and we learn from them.
- 5. A sentence is made up of words that express a complete thought.
- 6. Writing is a good way to communicate and show what we learn.
