<u>Course Description:</u> Seventh Grade Chorus is a performance-based class. This course provides opportunities for students to develop choral and performance skills with emphasis on stage performance. The students frequently perform and sometimes provide choreography with their singing. In addition, the students continue to sight read music and expand their knowledge of rhythm and pitch, proper singing technique, breath support, and tone production refinement, all of which are mastered at this level. Attendance at concerts is required.

Big Ideas:

- -Students will be able to sing as a member of a performing group.
- -Students will be able to sight read music.
- -Students will be able to distinguish between quality and non-quality performances.
