**Course Description:**

Students in 7th and 8th grade band training on woodwind, brass and percussion instruments. The

primary focus is

on the development and expansion of musical skills that lead to rewarding performance experiences.

In addition to large group ensembles, individual growth and achievement are encouraged through

new opportunities such as solo and ensemble contests, Honor Bands, and a heightened emphasis on

music technology.

**Big Ideas:** 

In preparation for a high school performance ensemble, the students learn the tenets of playing in a

section of like instruments, an ensemble setting, and the musicianship required for an artistic perform.

**Essential Learner Outcomes:** 

ELO 1: The students will understand the elements of rhythm.

The student will perform rhythms composed of syncopation, sixteenth notes, sixteenth note

patterns that go into one beat (including dotted eighth sixteenth, eight and two sixteenths, etc.)

and eighth note triplets.

The student will recognize and apply time signatures in: 4/4.3/4.2/4,6/8 and cut time.

The student will apply the following articulations: Marcato, Staccato, Tenuto, Different types of accents, advance slur patterns and legato.

The student will identify being out of tune from "beatless" or beat-based tuning.
