Eighth Grade Social Studies Updated May 2020

Course Description:

This course examines the major turning points in American history beginning with the creation of the Articles of Confederation, the origins of our constitution, The War of 1812, reform movements, Manifest Destiny, the Civil War, Reconstruction, the impact of the frontier, and the changing nature of business and government. The Missouri state standards provide both the framework and pace of the class. The curriculum and academic expectations will be differentiated to students of all learning styles and levels.

Big Ideas:

- 1. Basic knowledge and understanding of the rights, responsibilities and duties as an American citizen.
- 2. Basic knowledge and understanding of past historical events and their relationships to the present shaping the world today.
- 3. Basic knowledge and understanding of the United States government structure.
- 4. Basic knowledge and understanding of key figures and events of Constitutional Convention, Westward Expansion, War of 1812, The First Industrial Revolution, Jacksonian Democracy, Indian Removal Act, Missouri Compromise, Reform Movements, and the Civil War.
