First Grade Social Studies

Course Description:

First grade focuses on identifying rights and responsibilities of citizens, as well as how laws and rules are made. Students are taught to recognize and explain the significance of US symbols (Statue of Liberty, the Nation's Capital, and US flag) as well as, describe the contributions of George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. Students are also taught to use resources to locate relevant information and to describe relative location on a map and use compass rose to identify cardinal directions.

Big Ideas:

- 1. Citizens have rights and responsibilities.
- 2. Recognize and explain significance of US symbols (Statue of Liberty, the Nation's Capital, and US flag) and people (George Washington and Abraham Lincoln).
- 3. Locate a place on a map by pointing to it and describe its relative location (in relation to one or more other places) in order to get around in our world.
