A Parent Information Book has been developed and is updated each school year to inform parents of important procedures, rules, and dates at Lakewood Elementary. Lakewood Elementary will utilize the HAC (Home Access Center) system through e-school to communicate grades and progress each week. Teachers update the grade book each week and parents are sent notifications by e-school after they have set up their account. Parents are sent e-school codes at the beginning of each school year. Lakewood coordinates with UAMS to have the STRIVE Program in the school. This program has trained mental health counselors/social workers in the building to assist children who need help beyond that which can be provided by the school counselor.

Lakewood has a full-time nurse who is able to look after medical needs of students and make referrals for students who need more care.

Lakewood works with Lakewood United Methodist to provide after school care services for students. Scholarships are offered to students whose parents are not able to pay.
