FOIA Officers

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Illinois Freedom of Information Act, 5 ILCS 140/1.

It is the public policy of the State of Illinois that all persons are entitled to full and complete information regarding the affairs of government and the official acts and policies of those who represent them as public officials and public employees consistent with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). Such access is necessary to enable the people to fulfill their duties of discussing public issues fully and freely, making informed political judgments and monitoring government to ensure that it is being conducted in the public interest. REQUESTS

Requests for information under the Freedom of Information Act are to be submitted to the FOIA Officer in writing via postal mail, fax, email, or in person at the address listed above. No fee is charged for the first 50 pages of black and white, letter or legal sized copies. The fee for additional copies is 15 cents per page.

FOIA OFFICERS

The purpose of the FOIA officer is to provide timely and accurate responses to information requests governed by the Illinois Freedom of Information Act. There is no specific budget allocated to these responsibilities. There are two employees who serve as the FOIA officers.
