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Day Camps	Required face covering for adults and campers age 10 years of age and older. (Note: Staff may remove covering/mask during instruction, but must maintain a 12 ft distance when the covering is off.); hand sanitizer and sanitizing wipes readily available; face coverings are not required while exercising.	Small Venue, Large Venue and Outdoor Venue - 6 ft between campers and 12 ft between staff and campers when staff is not wearing a face covering while giving directions or instructing. Limit camp enrollment to numbers that will allow for proper physical distancing.	All efforts should be made to limit the congregation of children. Class sizes should be limited to 10 or less. The size of gatherings, events, and activities during the day should be sufficiently limited to allow for proper physical distancing and support proper hand hygiene.	All staff/volunteers entering the facility should be screened before entering including temperature check. Advise campers and families in advance about COVID-19 symptoms and exclusions, and place signage at all entrances. Camp must require curbside pick up and drop off. Ensure camp and staff groupings change as little as possible. Limit mixing between groups. Prohibit field trips and events with outside groups or other camps. Summer Day camps must prohibit persons from the facility except: camp or facility staff; children enrolled at the camp; parents or legal guardians who have children enrolled and present at the facility; and professionals providing services to children. Areas that are frequently touched (playground equipment, shared objects/toys, door handles, etc.) should be cleaned and disinfected between uses, or at least frequently throughout the day.

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Summer Workers	Wear face covering when inside facilities or when social distancing guidelines are not possible in an outdoor setting; goggles when possible; hand sanitizer and sanitizing wipes	Maintaining 6 ft distance when possible	Prefer no more than 2-3 student workers per site. Transportation and Facilities					



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Transportation	No bus transportation will be allowed for summer programs/activities. (Note: When onsite instruction resumes in the fall, busing will be allowed with as many precautions as reasonable.)				
Drop Off and Pick Up	Establish curbside drop-off and pick-up to limit close contact between parents and staff members. Adhere to physical distancing guidelines. If children must be met outside, an assigned staff member should ask all screening questions and escort the child into the facility as they arrive. Consider staggering arrival and drop-off times to manage the flow of students into and out of the facility. Communicate with parents that children are not to exit the vehicle until screening questions have been answered and student (age 10 +) is wearing face covering. Hand hygiene stations should be set up at the entrance of the facility so students can clean their hands before they enter the facility.				
Communication	Include information to parents regarding all actions the school is taking to mitigate potential exposure to the virus and keep students safe. Effective school re-entry plans will be for naught if parents or educators are not confident about the measures in place to keep students and staff safe. Advise families in advance about COVID-19 symptoms and exclusions.				
Restrooms	Schedule restroom breaks to avoid congregating. Create a schedule to ensure disinfecting of frequently touched areas such as light switches, faucet levers, paper towel dispensers, and flush levers. Custodial staff should wear appropriate PPE when disinfecting restrooms.				
Transitions/Hallways	Limit group activities and interaction between classes. Stagger class dismissals and transitions from one area to another area to avoid close contact. Consider moving teachers instead of students.				
Meals Onsite	Serve box or bag lunches for each student in classrooms to avoid gathering of students in the cafeteria. Students and staff should wash hands or use hand sanitizer before eating. Since students ages 10 and above will remove face covering while eating, 6 foot physical distancing (or as much distance as possible) should be maintained during the lunch or snack breaks. Hands and desk tops should be sanitized before eating. Staff preparing meals should wear appropriate PPE.				
Playgrounds/Recess	Outdoor recess is allowed. Students may play on the playground equipment. Contact games and sports should not be allowed. Students should wash hands or use hand sanitizer before going to the playground. Stagger outdoor play or divide playground into groups to allow for physical distancing to the extent possible.				
Water Fountains	Consider suspending the use of water fountains and plan for alternative hydration stations (e.g. bottled water, disposable water cups/cones, bottle filling stations).				



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Materials and Supplies	Keep each student's belongings separated from others' and in individually labeled containers, cubbies or areas. Ensure adequate supplies to minimize sharing of high touch materials to the extent possible (e.g. art supplies, math manipulatives, writing utensils) or limit use of supplies and equipment by one group of students at a time. Avoid sharing electronic devices, toys, books, and other games or learning aids. Clean and disinfect between use.				
Visitors and Volunteers	Limit nonessential visitors, volunteers, and activities involving other groups. Restrict attendance of those from higher transmission areas. Document all visitors including day, time and location of the visit. All adults entering the facilities must be screened and wear cloth face covering during the duration of the visit.				
Facilities Before Re-entry and During Summer Activities	Occupied areas of the facilities should be cleaned and disinfected at the end of each day/session with careful attention to frequently touched surfaces. https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/reopen-guidance.html				
Students/Campers Who Become Sick During the Day	If a student/camper becomes sick during the day, contact the parent or guardian immediately and separate the student/camper from others while maintaining proper supervision until they are picked up.

Face Coverings	For safety reasons, under no circumstances should a mask be placed on a child under 2 years of age. Face coverings are not required for children under the age of 10, as many children in this group will have difficulty consistently wearing a mask. However, if a child older than 2 but younger than 10 is able to consistently wear a face covering, it is encouraged.				



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
