All teachers have made parents aware that they are available for communication at anytime whether it be by phone, emails, texts, or in person. There are also newsletters that go home during MAP assessment time to explain the process and there is regular information sent home about the NWEA assessments and what those test results mean, and about the Learning Standards. Teachers also use the SEESAW program to involve parents in their students daily work. Teachers are able to post work samples to SEESAW to show parents examples of specific assignments. This allows parents and teachers to provide feedback for the student.

We will be discussing ways to train parents to help their child's achievement at our next Annual Evaluation. During this meeting parents are offered training on logging in to our student information system to monitor student grades as well as training on getting connected with the SEESAW app.

At our monthly staff meetings we are always talking about and brainstorming ways of communicating with parents more effectively. We also send out a parent survey in the spring to get their feedback on what is working and not working in our parent involvement arena. The result from these surveys are shared with the staff and as a team we decide how to address any concerns.
