REPORTS

Superintendent, Thelma Szarell

On April 5, Elementary parents accompanied Mrs. Szarell to the Parent Workshop which was sponsored by Federal Programs. The presentation was focused on helping and encouraging young children to read. Video judging for drug abuse prevention will take place tomorrow in the Greene County Courthouse. These videos play an important role in our effort to promote healthy activities available in Greene County that do not involve drugs and alcohol; and the awareness of the unhealthy, physical and negative legal consequences of drugs and alcohol abuse. Mrs. Szarell and Mr. Painter will be attending the PAFPC conference from May 1-4.

Business Manager, Jessica Bissett

Mrs. Bissett is continuing with the preparation of the 2016-2017 budget, which will be discussed at the next committee meeting. She has been working with the support negotiations calculations and reconciling accounts. With the passing of the State's 2015-2016 budget, West Greene is scheduled to receive \$487,930.00 on April 29. Current revenue for the district is \$15,000,000 and expenditures are \$11,800.000. Mrs. Bissett will attend the Business Manager's meeting tomorrow at the Intermediate Unit 1 to review health insurance.

Middle-Senior High School Principal, Scott Sakai

Mr. Sakai introduced the gifted students to speak about the video they are submitting the Judges Award, which revolves around drug awareness. The Drama Club's video submission and the Peer Mentoring group's video submission were also presented.

Elementary Principal, Don Painter

Kindergarten registration has concluded and 49 students are registered for 2016-2017. Mrs. White was on-hand to assist with determining bus stops for each of the Kindergarten students registered. All Kindergarten registrants will be invited to "Kindergarten Club" over the summer. The PSSA testing concluded this morning. The Elementary Center students collected \$4,700 in five days for Relay for Life. The Greene County Conservation District held a county-wide poster contest entitled "All About Trees" and all three winners were West Greene students.

Director of Educational and Informational Technology, Bob Ward

Time has been mostly spent with system updates, server updates and security patches. Earlier in the month Mr. Ward attended the Technology Coordinator's meeting where the new Regional WAN contract, bundle service and costs were discussed.

Director of Food Service, Jim Elsenheimer

West Greene is in the running for a grant to do a modified summer food program through the Greater Pittsburgh Food Bank. Funding would involve transportation. The reimbursement rate coming from the grant would off-set West Greene's costs. Mr. Elsenheimer will be following up with the board.

Director of Facilities, John McDermitt

The Honeywell EPI system has been installed. The HVAC system should be operating more efficiently in the classrooms, and even saving the district money. A bad seam was located and the roofing leak in the Elementary Center has been fixed.

Athletic Director, Bill Simms

Jim Romanus was honored as a finalist for Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year. Ron Faust won the award, but it was great to see the amount of respect and admiration displayed to Mr. Romanus among his coaching peers. Also at the banquet, a tremendous speech about dealing with adversity was given by Luke Blanock of Canon-McMillan. Mr. Simms thanked Stacy Berdine, Administrators and spring sports coaches for dealing with an abnormally difficult spring. He also thanked John McDermitt and his maintenance staff for their work at Center Township Park. 7&8 Grade Softball is currently 5 and 2, with 17 girls on the squad. The Varsity Track team most recently competed in the Section 6-AA meet, and brought home several medals and ribbons. Mikhayla Post continues to run well in the 200 and 400 meter. Rachel Jones won medals in the distance 1600 and 3200 races. Kaitlin Kreuzer has re-broke her school record in the triple jump, and we have several relay teams and throwers putting up good times and distances. The Boys' Baseball team is 4 and 7. They are currently in 4th place, and need some help to get a playoff berth now. The Softball team is currently 15 and 1, and has clinched a playoff berth. They have an opportunity to tie/break/set the school record for wins in a season, and win a section title for the first time in 33 years. The 1983 team was the last softball team to win a section title, and they finished 18 and 3. The girls are currently the top-ranked Class teams in the WPIAL and in some publications are ranked No. 1 in the state. In another publication, we are ranked in the top 500 programs in the entire country. Spring Sport Senior Day has been scheduled for May 5, at Center Township Park.

Peacock-Keller Representative, Barbara Graham

Mrs. Graham had nothing further to add to the written report already received by the board.

CTC Representative, Jan Berdine

The Child Care and Drafting Program have been terminated due to low attendance. The new program being added this fall is the Sports Medicine/Rehabilitative Technician. Two teachers will be furloughed at the end of the school year. Open-house was held April 27, and was well attended.

PSBA Liaison, Timothy Mankey

The ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act) was signed into law in December 2015. This replaces the NCLBA (No Child Left Behind Act). All states, including Pennsylvania, are now in the process of crafting new state plans that are expected to be submitted for approval to the US Department of Education.

WGEA Representative, Winifred Sweeney

Mrs. Cowden reported the Opportunities Scholarship and Thelma Hoge Scholarship interviews were conducted. ELA Math and Science PSSAs have been completed. Former teacher, Jessie Meighen has a great-grandson who was commissioned as a Navy S.E.A.L. Mrs. McCollum's International Club will have a chicken roast at Tractor's Supply on April 30. Mr. Armstrong's Envirothon team released 205 trout. The Greenhouse will open May 2. Mrs. Day's class will host K-6 art show on the same night as the Elementary Spring Music Program on May 10.

Parent Organization Representative, Connie Bloom

Mrs. Bloom reported that new officers were going to be elected at their next meeting. Fun Day will be held May 6, weather permitting; and the Teacher Appreciation Luncheon will be held May 12.
