Statement of Purpose

Staff-Parent Communication

Communication with parents will include district newsletters, principal updates, and newspaper articles in the Milan Standard. Staff will be encouraged to contact parents by phone, notes, conferences, and possible home visits. Textcaster will be used to notify families of activities and messages from the District. A student handbook will be distributed yearly. It will contain the Federal Programs Complaint Procedures and Parents' Right-to-Know. Parents are encouraged to take the initiative in calling their child's teacher when they are concerned about a problem. They may also call the school office to relay messages. Parents are encouraged to talk with their child's teacher first however; they may also come at any time to talk with the elementary principal. Communications will also be sent home in Spanish if needed. Staff, parents, and community members will participate in developing ways to improve home-school communication.

Evaluation

A district-wide Title I Advisory Committee will be involved in the process of school review and improvement. Parents of children in the Title I program will be part of this group. The aim will be to evaluate the schools in this district, collecting information in a variety of ways, including visits to the schools and observations of classes.

There will be an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the Title I parental involvement program, and parents will be asked for their input. The evaluation will include an assessment of how much parental involvement is increasing and what barriers to parental participation still need to be overcome. The school district will revise its Parental Involvement Policy on the basis of this annual review.

Last year's annual review is included in this plan and will be replaced each year for review.
