7:325 Student Fundraising Activities

Extra-Curricular Fundraising

Any and all fundraising, direct or non-direct, must be pre-approved by the Superintendent, or Principal if the Superintendent is unavailable, before starting.

Excessive purchases of items not needed for the function of the organization, or activity, are discouraged. Thompsonville CUSD #174 will supply the basic needed items for all school related activities. Items being uniforms, balls, bats, etc.

Fundraising is limited to two (2) activities involving direct community sales. Direct community sales being from pre-priced catalogs, flyers, or any printed material sent home with students for the intent of soliciting money from the community.

At no time is any student to be pressured with a directive requiring them to sell a set minimum amount.

Non-direct fundraising is to be kept to a minimum. Non-direct sales include activities where suggested participation is all that is requested. Examples may include car wash, chili supper, yard sale, etc. Pre-approval is also required for non-direct fundraising.

No fundraising money is to be used for personalized items. Personalized items are to be purchased by the individual student.

Items purchased with solicited money must be turned in after use to be considered for use the next year.

The fundraising supervisor is not to include himself or herself in the use of any item purchased with solicited money.

With the fundraising request the following questions should be addressed:

1. Name of Organization Holding the Fundraiser
2. Reason for holding the Fundraising
3. Intended Amount (\$) to Be Raised
4. Intended Audience Solicited

This list is not all-inclusive. Some decisions may be based on special circumstances.
