PLAN A

SCHOOL DISTRICT SCREENING PROTOCOL

In an effort to prevent the spread of communicable diseases, especially during a pandemic or public health crisis, the district may implement the following protocol to control and restrict access to school property, activities and events:

- 1. The district encourages parents, legal guardians, and all school employees to self-screen at home. See pages 2 & 3 for the CDC Screening List.
- 2. If a student or employee has a temperature of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, the student or employee should remain at home until the individual has been free of fever for twenty-four (24) hours.
- 3. The district may screen any individual who enters a school facility which screening process may include taking temperatures, asking health-related questions, and isolating those that have symptoms of a communicable disease.
- 4. The district will adhere to guidelines set by local, state and federal health and safety guidelines when feasible.

OPEN HOUSE & VISITORS

- BACK TO SCHOOL PK-4th Grades: No entry into buildings-Drive Thru Drop Off ONLY
- 2. BACK TO SCHOOL 5th-7th Grades: No entry into buildings-Drive Thru Drop Off ONLY
- 3. BACK TO SCHOOL 8th-12th Grades: July 6th, 7th, & 8th @ the High School BY CLASS APPOINTMENT ONLY
- 4. PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES PK-12th Grades scheduled by teachers, conducted via telephone
- NO VISITORS in school buildings unless authorized by the building principal. (APPOINTMENT ONLY)

BUSES

- 1. Only family members can sit together in groups.
- 2. Open Windows for airflow.
- 3. Masks are required for all riders. Must be on face properly before entering the bus.
- 4. Hand Sanitizer is required as a student enters the bus.
- 5. Temperature of each student will be taken as they enter the bus.
- 6. The Clorox 360 Machine will be used after morning and afternoon routes.

SCHOOL BUILDING

- 1. Masks/shields are recommended but not required for students and staff.
- 2. Students in classes led by teachers or staff members at risk will be required to wear masks or face shields while in the teacher's classroom. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 3. Daily Cleaning and then sanitizing of everything using the Clorox 360 Machine.
- 4. Teachers will be required to sanitize desks and equipment in their classrooms several times a day. School will provide the disinfectant.
- 5. Hand Sanitizing stations will be in each classroom.
- 6. Washing hands will be required several times a day.
- 7. Water Fountains are being replaced with Bottle Filling Stations.

STUDENTS & STAFF ENTERING THE SCHOOL

- 1. All students are expected to have completed a home screening before going to school each and every day. Below is the CDC Screening List. If a student is ill, please contact the school and keep the child home.
 - A. Symptoms (CDC.gov)

People or children with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People or children with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Unexplained or new cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Unexplained muscle or body aches
- Unexplained headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Unexplained sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea or abdominal pain
- Rash
- Bloodshot eyes
- Feeling extra tired

This list does not include all possible symptoms. If a yes answer was to any of the above questions-STOP! DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL and/or activities. Contact your medical provider. Employees notify your immediate supervisor.

- 2. Each student and staff member will have a required temperature check each day upon entering their school building/bus.
- 3. Any student who has a 100 temperature or above upon entering, will be isolated until picked up by a parent. The student who has a fever will not be allowed to come to school for 10 days unless they test negative for the COVID-19 at which point they can enter earlier.

BREAKFAST

- 1. All students will report to their classroom with breakfast in a grab-n-go format no earlier than 7:45 A.M.
- 2. No large gatherings allowed during this time.

LUNCH TIME

- 1. Social Distancing Guidelines will be followed.
- 2. Tables by grade level will be implemented with spacing between students.
- 3. Students will have access to hand sanitizer before their meal and afterwards.
- 4. Disinfecting of tables and seats will take place after each class leaves.

PE

1. Social Distancing Guidelines will be followed. The Dome, Old Gym, and designated outdoor areas will be used for PE classes.

BAND/VOCAL/MUSIC

- 1. Social Distancing Guidelines will be followed.
- 2. All band and music/vocal classes will be held in the multipurpose and designated outdoor areas.

<u>IMPORTANT DETAILS BY SITE</u>

ELEMENTARY PK-4th GRADES

- 1. We will do only GRADE LEVEL ACTIVITIES. General Assemblies will be by Zoom. (Ex: Rise and Shine)
- 2. Breakfast will be in the classrooms from 7:45 A.M.-8:05 A.M.
- 3. Lunchroom area- Social Distancing Guidelines will be followed. Tables by grade level will be implemented with spacing between students.
- 4. Music will be held in the multipurpose room and PE in the Dome, Old Gym, and designated outdoor areas. Students will attend only with their class.
- 5. No pep assemblies/school wide gatherings will be held until further notice.

6. Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held virtually or by phone.

MIDDLE SCHOOL 5th-7th GRADES

- 1. 5th and 6th grade students will be divided into two sections
- 2. 7th grade students will be divided into three sections.
- 3. Bathroom breaks will be by section. No classroom transitions as usual.
- 4. Breakfast will be in the MS Students Homeroom from 7:45 A.M.-8:05 A.M.
- 5. Music will be in the MS Vocal Room or in a designated outdoor area.
- 6. Band will be in the MP Band Room or in a designated outdoor area.
- 7. No pep assemblies/school wide gatherings will be held until further notice.
- 8. Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held virtually or by phone.

HIGH SCHOOL 8th-12th GRADES

- 1. Breakfast and lunch will be offered as a grab & go at the south HS entrance. Students will report to their 1st Hour after grabbing their breakfast from 7:45 A.M.-8:00 A.M. There will not be any congregating in the Commons Area.
- 2. Vocal will be in the HS Vocal Room. Social Distancing will be practiced.
- 3. Band will be held in the HS parking lot and the HS Band Room. Social Distancing will be practiced.
- 4. No pep assemblies/school wide gatherings will be held until further notice.
- 5. Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held virtually or by phone.

SICK STUDENT/STAFF MEMBER PROTOCOL

1. Any student or staff member who has a fever upon entering school or the bus, or one who develops fever and or symptoms of COVID-19 will be isolated until picked up by a parent. The student or staff member who has a 100 degree temperature or above will not be allowed to come to school for 10 days from onset of the illness and must have been fever and symptom free for 3 days (72 hours) without the use of a fever reducer unless they test negative for the COVID-19 at which point they can enter earlier, but must be fever and symptom free for 24 hours and they must have documentation from a physician or health department with a diagnosis of another illness.

- 2. Any student or staff member who is exposed to someone with the COVID-19 will have to self-quarantine for 14 calendar days.
- 3. Any student or staff member who travels to a known HOT SPOT in or out of the country will have to self-quarantine for 14 days.

PLAN B

The decision to move to Plan B will be made with collaboration from the county health officials concerning the percentage of students infected with the COVID-19 Virus.

SCHOOL SITES WILL BE SHUT DOWN FOR 24 HOURS for thorough cleaning and sanitization.

NOTIFICATION

1. Immediate notification of school closure and important information will be pushed out on the Hinton Schools App, posted on the school website, posted on Facebook, and put out on television stations 4, 5, 9, and 25.

MASK or FACE SHIELDS

- 1. Masks or face shields will be required at all times. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 2. Masks or face shields will be required on buses. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Students will be allowed to remove masks when outdoors.

BUSES

- 1. Students getting to school by another means of transportation is highly recommended.
- 2. Only family members can sit together in groups
- 3. Open Windows for airflow
- 4. Masks/face shields are required.
- 5. Hand Sanitizer is required as a student enters the bus.
- 6. Temperature of each student will be taken as they enter the bus.
- 7. The Clorox 360 Machine will be used after morning and afternoon routes.

BREAKFAST

- 1. All students will report to their classroom with breakfast in a grab-n-go format no earlier than 7:45 A.M.
- 2. No large gatherings allowed during this time.

LUNCH

 Students will pick up their lunches from the cafeteria or their lunches will be delivered to them in their classrooms. Middle School students will eat lunch in their homerooms at their desk. Elementary students will eat lunch in their classroom at their desk. High School students will be able to continue to leave campus or receive their lunch in the HS Comet Kitchen from the Child Nutrition Program.

SANITIZING/CLEANING

1. Daily Cleaning and then sanitizing everything using the Clorox 360 Machine will continue.

PLAN C

NOTIFICATION

1. Immediate notification of school closure and important information will be pushed out on the Hinton Schools App, posted on the school website, posted on Facebook, and put out on television stations 4, 5, 9, and 25.

EDUCATION

- 1. Hinton Schools will go to our VIRTUAL EDUCATION district wide until it is safe to return.
- 2. The decision to go VIRTUAL for our district will be made with the collaboration from the county health department.

CLEANING & SANITIZING

1. Cleaning and sanitizing will continue on a daily basis.

CHILD NUTRITION (Breakfast & Lunches)

 We will have a plan in place to provide meals daily to students. The drive-thru will be located on the east side of the cafeteria. Delivery will be at designated areas. More information will become available if the decision is to move to Plan C.
