



Choctaw Academy

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: *How do I register my student for the Choctaw Academy?*

A: **Step 1:** A parent or guardian should complete the online application found on the Dyer County Schools Facebook page and the dyerco.net website. Complete one application for each child. **Step 2:** Attend registration day (August 3, 2020) at your regular school to pick up a registration packet. Students will be enrolled at their regular school and assigned to the Choctaw Academy. Once the registration packet is returned to the school, students will be assigned a Chromebook and given a Student Information Guide that further explains the program.

Q: *Will my student be allowed to switch from Choctaw Academy to a traditional school setting?*

A: Students will be allowed to move between Choctaw Academy and the traditional school setting at each 9-week grading period.

Q: *Will my student receive a device to use while attending Choctaw Academy?*

A: Dyer County Schools will issue a Chromebook to all students in grades K-12 who participate in the academy. Families must provide their own internet access.

Q: *Will my student be required to be online during the hours of 8:00am-3:00pm?*

A: Students will have a weekly check-in time that will be a minimum of one hour. That time will be determined at the beginning of the school year. All other work can be completed at the student/family's convenience as long as the assignments for each class are completed by the weekly deadline.

Q: *What is the cost of Choctaw Academy?*

A: There is no cost for in-state students to attend Choctaw Academy.

Q: *Will students receive a diploma from DCHS if they attend Choctaw Academy?*

A: 12th grade students who complete all the requirements for graduation under the DCHS Handbook will receive a diploma from Dyer County High School.

Q: *Will students who attend Choctaw Academy be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony held at DCHS?*

A: 12th grade students who have met the requirements to walk in the graduation ceremony at DCHS will be allowed to participate in graduation.
