

Purpose: A running record is a tool used to determine word recognition, reading fluency, reading strategies (self corrections), and comprehension.

Directions:

1. Choose any passage. The passage can be familiar or unfamiliar; it depends on what you are trying to find out about a student's reading behaviors.
2. Count out 100 words.
3. It is easiest to make a copy of the passage for yourself to use as the student reads to you. However, you can also just count the number of lines in the passage and record correct reading and miscues (errors) as the student reads. (see below)
4. Have the student read the passage orally.
5. Place a check above each word that is read correctly.
6. Record any miscues by writing what the student said above the correct word. Words that are omitted, inserted, or substituted are included as miscues.
7. Words that are self corrected are not included as miscues.
8. Take anecdotal notes about student reading behaviors – self corrections, strategies to determine unfamiliar words, etc.
