## VIRTUAL LEARNING RULES/REGULATIONS

2020-2021

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Students enrolled in the Virtual Learning program in the Marion County School System will be working through Edgenuity. Edgenuity courses feature rigorous instruction which help ensure students build content knowledge and essential skills. Students participating in the Virtual Learning program will remain as a student of L.K. Moss Elementary School and must adhere to all rules/regulations of the program.

- Students must enroll in the Virtual Learning program for
  - Minimum of 45 days for students in Kdg – 5<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Students may participate in school-sponsored events and extra-curricular activities pending all academic and other requirements are met for participation.
- Students participating in the Virtual Learning program will adhere to the Marion County School System's calendar. (You're not expected to complete coursework on school holidays.)
- Students must assume the responsibility of maintaining a strong commitment of completion of the virtual assignments. Parental support is vital in ensuring the student's success.
- Students must log in daily and work on all subjects. (i.e., don't log in and work on Math until completed)
- Students must provide a device for virtual learning. If you have an issue with your device, contact the school.
- Students must have reliable internet access which supports Virtual Learning.
- All grades earned by a student enrolled in the Virtual Learning program will become a part of his/her permanent record.
- Students and parents must have an open line of communication with the Virtual Learning contact person (email, telephone, etc.). (You will be notified of the contact person before the first day of school.)
