## **POLICIES AND REGULATIONS**

## **REGULATIONS: STUDENT RETENTION AND PROMOTION**

- Retention or promotion of a student in any grade, kindergarten through grade 8, shall be
  determined by a multi-disciplinary team consisting of the appropriate members of the
  Special Needs Team (SNT) and/or Student Assistance Team (SAT), building administrator,
  classroom teacher or teachers, and the parent or guardian. Additional team members may
  be asked to provide information such as a school counselor and/or school psychologist.
- 2. A retention or promotion decision shall be recommended by a team only after careful consideration of a wide variety of information about the student designed to help the team make a decision that is educationally and emotionally best for the student.
- 3. A criterion-referenced assessment may be helpful to teams in making sound decisions about student retention or promotion.
- 4. If a criterion-referenced assessment is not used, the multi-disciplinary team may find it useful to consider the following criteria:
  - student's age
  - present grade placement
  - previous grade level assignment recommendations
  - school enrollment history
  - school attendance
  - history of learning disabilities
  - present level of academic achievement and performance
  - student's attitude about retention or promotion
  - student's interest in school work
  - social and emotional development
  - history of serious behaviors
  - other pertinent information deemed helpful by the team.
- 5. Specific information regarding the parent's/guardian's support of the team's decision should be recorded on the form and placed in the student's cumulative record.
- 6. In instances where a parent requests a child to be retained or promoted and the child is receiving special education services, the child's Individual Education Plan (IEP) team will serve as the multi-disciplinary team. All discussions and documentation will follow regulations pertaining to special education laws.
