

Mission Statement

Meetings

The Music Boosters meet the second Tuesday of every month (except December) at 7:00 pm during the school year. Everyone is welcome to attend.



What do the Music Boosters do?

We assist the Directors and various groups as needed with volunteer efforts such as chaperoning trips, loading/unloading, set up/take down, and coordinating the annual Pop, Popcorn, & Pops Concert. In short, we assist where we can! Also... we fundraise to help off-set any expenses outside of the school budget.

How do we fundraise?

The Music Boosters offer several fundraising opportunities throughout the year including:

- Concessions booth workers at CHS activities
- Red Wheel fundraiser
- Aberdeen Area Business Card sales
- Gift wrapping during the holiday season
- Helping the Exchange Club with posting flags on holidays

Your student has their own individual account!

The Music Boosters are a bit unique in that, while a small percent of all fundraisers go into the General Fund, each student also has their own individual account that is tracked and maintained by the Treasurer. For example, when a student sells items during the Red Wheel fundraiser, a percent of the sales they are responsible for will go directly into their account! The student can then use these funds for things such as instrument purchases/repairs, trip payments, and other music-related expenses (i.e. marching band shoes, show choir fees, orchestra t-shirt, etc.).

What do the Music Boosters do with the dollars in the General Fund?

- We help pay for some meals on music trips.
- We provide college scholarships and camp scholarships.
- We help with repair & enhancements to the school-owned instruments and equipment.
- We help pay for various medals and awards.
- We provide water & snacks for student music events/rehearsals.

How do the Music Boosters decide on what to pay for?

- We vote at the CHS Music Booster meetings. Show up your vote counts.
- The Executive Board also has authority to make these decisions.

Some guidelines we use:

- Does it benefit the majority in the music program?
- Does it promote the growth, activity or improve the music program?
- Have the program leaders/students/parents/guardians been active in raising funds that contribute to the Music Boosters?
- Is it a required expense?
- Should this be an expense the Music Boosters assist with or should it be part of the school's budget?

How can YOU help?

- Come to the meetings!
- Sign up to help... and then show up to help.
- It takes a village... help with activities, events, and fundraisers as much as you are able. Many hands make light work!
