

# IN-PERSON OPTION

## Globe Unified School District #1

### In-Person Option

Students enrolled in our in-person option will follow the same calendar as all other GUSD students and will begin school on August 17, 2020.

***What can families expect while learning in the in-person environment?*** Students will participate in the same learning they are used to but with enhanced health and safety measures.

Students are asked to commit to the hybrid learning option for at least one trimester (exceptions may be made on an individual basis). Students and families in the in-person model should be prepared to work within a hybrid or remote learning options in the case of rolling closures.

Please note that elements to this plan may be subject to change based upon new information and guidance from state and health agency partners. We will share updates/changes as they become available.

### ***The in-person student experience:***

- On the bus (if needed):
  - Drivers, monitors and riders will be required to wear a face covering and will be subject to temperature checks.
  - Students will sit in assigned seats when possible.
- Students will be marked present when they arrive in class (or in each class period if HDMS or GHS student) daily and on time.
- Students will follow their daily schedule with enhanced health and safety measures.
  - Masks/shields/face coverings will be required to attend class in-person per the Mayor of Globe's proclamation and safe standards. Teachers will allow for 'mask/shield' breaks as needed, appropriate and when physical distancing standards can be maintained.
  - Students and staff will undergo health checks when arriving on-campus which will include temperature checks, observation and health questions.
- Classroom desks will face the same direction. If tables are used in the classroom, students will sit at opposite ends of the table and/or have provided space dividers on tables.
- Teachers will provide in-person instruction in the classroom with supplemental materials sent home for practice (i.e.: homework).
- Students will report directly to classrooms as common spaces, playgrounds, etc. will not be open outside of the regular school day.
- Students will not dress out for PE and locker rooms will be closed.
- Parents are encouraged to actively participate in student learning to assist our schools with ensuring student participation, attendance and course completion.

- Students may participate in extracurricular activities following health and safety guidelines.
- Special education students will be provided with support in accordance with the Individualized Education Plan to every extent possible.
- Information on state testing will be shared with students and families after the beginning of the school year.
