## **SVHS Re-Entry Guidance for Parents/Guardians & Students**

\*\* Please understand that all of these guidelines are subject to change as we receive new guidance from the CDC, IDOE, Vermillion County Health Dept., and our corporation policy.

\*\* The safety of our students and staff is our top priority. We have also tried to consider the social and emotional needs of our students and include opportunities for them to socialize with their peers and safely enjoy spending time together at school.

### **Transportation**

- We will be operating on a delayed start for secondary schools. SVHS will start with 1<sup>st</sup> period at 9:00 and dismiss after 7<sup>th</sup> period at 4:00.
  - Buses will arrive between 8:40 – 8:50.
  - Bus riders will enter through door W on the west side of the building.
  - Car riders and student drivers will enter through entrance C in the commons area and/or through entrance A at the main entrance.

### **Procedures**

- Students will be assigned a homeroom, as they are every year. Students will report directly to their homeroom upon arrival, for the first 15 minutes of the day. If students are eating breakfast at school, they need to arrive in plenty of time to get their breakfast and go to homeroom in order to eat it.
- Masks/face coverings will be worn by staff and students during transition times and when students are not seated in traditional classroom seating patterns. Masks will not be removed until class begins and all students are seated. Teachers will direct students when they are able to remove their masks. Students should bring their own masks to school. If they are cloth/fabric masks, they need to be laundered frequently.
- All desks will be in traditional rows facing the same direction. Desks will be spaced apart as much as allowable in the classrooms.
- Desks will be sanitized as often as possible throughout the school day. This may be done by teachers after class ends or by students as they enter the classroom.
- There will be directional traffic patterns in the hallways. The hallways will have a ONE WAY traffic flow. Some hallways will be both directions, but traffic will need to stay to the right side of the hall.

- We will not be using lockers at this point. **We ask that students try to bring as little as possible from home.** Students can carry their backpacks or small bags with them throughout the day. Anything brought into the building is subject to search and seizure by school personnel if there is probable suspicion of anything that violates school policy/rules.
- SVHS cell phone policy is still the same as it always has been. Cell phones are to be turned off and out of sight during class times. When students are in homeroom before school, at lunch, or during transition times, they may have them out.
- Students will be provided reusable water bottles that can be refilled at water filling stations throughout the building. The water bottles will be left in homeroom classrooms overnight and do not go home with the students. Water bottles will be sanitized in the cafeteria once a week.
- Sharing of classroom supplies is highly prohibited. Students need to make sure they have their own supplies for their classes. Teachers will let students know during the first couple of days of school, what supplies are needed for the year.
- Frequent hand washing is encouraged and hand sanitizing stations will be placed throughout the building. All students will be given a small bottle of hand sanitizer and we will refill as needed. Students need to keep ahold of the bottles due to a limited amount. Students should not share their bottles with others.
- No visitors will be allowed in the building with exception of case conferences and other scheduled meetings. Parents dropping off items for students will do so in the secure entry.

### **Meals**

**Breakfast** – There will be a grab and go breakfast option. Cafeteria staff members will enter student numbers and hand the breakfast bag to the student. Students will eat breakfast in their homeroom. Breakfast pick-up will be available at bus entrance W and in the commons area.

**Lunch** – We will have two lunch periods as we have done in the past. However, we will have to utilize multiple spaces to accommodate all students and maintain social distancing. Some students will eat in the cafeteria, in the commons, in the gymnasium, and/or in their 4<sup>th</sup> period classroom. Groups will be determined based on their 4<sup>th</sup> period class and the numbers of students. Staff will take lunch orders first thing during 1<sup>st</sup> period classes. Those students who are WRCTE at another school in the morning will have to give their lunch order to the secretary before they go to their WRCTE site. Students are allowed to and encouraged to bring their lunch. They will have to carry it with them throughout the day. Serving items will be paper and plastic and thrown away at the end of the meal. No food can be kept from the school lunch to take home or eat later.

- There will be 4 lunch pick up locations in the building.
  - Those assigned to a classroom their pick up point will be in the main office.
  - Those assigned in the cafeteria will pick up their lunch in the kitchen serving line.
  - Those assigned in the gymnasium will pick up their lunch at the north and south gym doors.

\*\* We all understand and know that this school year is not going to be typical or traditional. We will all be adjusting how we have done things in the past. This affects all of us. It's not about whether we like it or not, whether we agree or disagree, it is what we must do. We need your help to ensure everyone at SVHS stays safe and healthy. It is very important that you help us in emphasizing the importance of these guidelines and protocols.

\*\* Due to the health and safety of our students and staff, the guidelines for social distancing and masks must be followed. Students will receive consequences for not following these guidelines. Your help in reinforcing the importance of these guidelines will go a long way in helping this transition be a smooth one.
