Anna Wessing, Early Childhood Director, introduced Dawn Thomas, a new GSRP Teacher.

Superintendent Matthew Miller thanked our school board members for the time and work they invest for the good of our students and the school district. Our school board members develop policies and make tough decisions that help shape the future of our education system. They bear the responsibility and oversight of a \$17 million dollar budget and 6 facilities. They look out for the best interest of our students and make decisions with their best interest in mind. Our board members have the desire to make the right decisions even when the public may not agree. They are dedicated individuals who are committed to the continuing success of our schools and students.

Superintendent Miller presented certificates to each board member thanking them for their dedication.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

BARCLAY HILLS EDUCATION CENTER BUILDING REPORT Rhonda Newman reported that the committee met and discussed the 2016-17 mid-year budget adjustments. After the committee reviewed each item it was recommended, with their support, to be presented to the full board for approval.

Principal Tina Maxwell shared the mission and belief statement for Barclay Hills Education Center. She stated that Barclay's staff has a heart for their students. Mrs. Maxwell has six school improvement goals:

- 1) All students will improve their writing skills
- 2) All students will improve their math skills
- 3) All students will improve their reading skills
- 4) All students will demonstrate behaviors they need for success in the workplace
- 5) All students will improve their science skills
- 6) All students will improve their social studies skills

Some initiatives that Barclay has initiated and is working on include: Collins Writing, Comprehension Toolkit (Reading), Academic Vocabulary, Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS), Positive Behavior Supports (RAPS), College/Career Readiness, Learning Sciences International (LSI)/Marzano Training, Trauma Training for staff, and Education For the Arts (EFA) Partnership.

Mrs. Maxwell shared the data from the School Wide Information System (SWIS) which tracks office referrals. Mrs. Maxwell shared that overall they have seen fewer referrals this year.

Mrs. Maxwell mentioned some of the highlights for the year which included: 29 students in Parchment Virtual Academy, Spanish being offered, half time counselor (Dominique Hunt), Department of Human Service (DHS) Partnership (Dan Isaacs), partnership with EFA to provide Arts for their students, a grant from The Fetzer Institute for \$5,000, Trauma Training and Coaching with Frank Vidimos and Amy Mack, Air Zoo Scholarship for \$600, 20 students have been accepted to KVCC for next school year, and 18 students eligible for tuition incentive program scholarship.

Mrs. Maxwell's vision for Barclay Hills Education Center is for them to be a trauma-informed school—being informed about and sensitive to trauma, and providing a safe, stable, and understanding environment for students and staff. A primary goal is to prevent re-injury or retraumatization by acknowledging trauma and its triggers, and avoiding stigmatizing and punishing students unnecessarily.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Matthew Miller shared a recent Michigan Department of Education (MDE) News Release. The MDE released the 2016 School Score Cards; Top-to-Bottom List; and Reward Schools. Parchment School District had two schools named as Reward Schools, only one other building in Kalamazoo County received this distinction. Schools indentified as Reward Schools are those that did not receive a red score and have achieved one or more of the following:

- Top 5 percent of schools on the Top-to-Bottom list
- Top 5 percent of school making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement)
- Beating the Odds by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools

Parchment Schools were named Rewards School based on the beating the odds.

Superintendent Miller mentioned that the District will be sending a Press Release out regarding the generous donation by an area business person to cover the overdue lunch balances at our elementary buildings. The business person is challenging others to get involved.

## OTHER SPECIAL REPORTS

Amy Hansen, Special Education Supervisor, presented a Special Education Overview and Cross Indicator Analysis. Mrs. Hansen shared that we collaborate with KRESA staff for our early childhood services for our youngest students, birth – 3 years. We work with a variety of outside agencies to support our students with services: doctor's offices, counselors, parent mentors, transition staff, and many others.

Parchment is currently providing special education services to 205 students in the district. To date we have had 42 students with services move into Parchment School District this school year.

We currently have seven students participating in Work Based Learning (WLB). This program is provided with the support of KRESA for students in grades 11 and 12.
