FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Nancy Lenz reported that the committee met and discussed proposed pay rate increase for substitutes, seasonal, and childcare workers. The rate increases are due, in part, to Federal minimum wage increases for 2017 and 2018.

The committee is recommending the proposed increases to the full board for approval.

NORTHWOOD BUILDING REPORT

Principal Sarah Neumann shared the focus areas of Northwood Elementary: Smile and Move, Support and Services, Professional Learning Communities (PLC's), Curriculum, Unity and Positivity. They continue to focus on the whole family, not just students and academics.

Northwood's School Improvement Goals are to achieve proficiency in reading, math, writing, science, and social studies. Their strategies are to have teacher goals mirror school improvement goals; teachers will incorporate strategies for active participation and student engagement into instructional practice.

eSpark is in its second year for 1st graders, and we added 2nd grade as a district in the fall. We are expanding to include kindergarten during the 2nd semester. This is an app-based program where students utilize iPad's for individualized learning. It provides individualized pathways for our students focusing on, reading skill development, problem solving skills, communication of ideas/concepts, and deeper understanding.

M-STEP data is still embargoed, so real data could not be shared publicly. Northwood students out-performed the State of Michigan in all content areas and grade levels. They showed significant growth in Science. Our interventions and supports are working!

Northwood Elementary along with Parchment School District is using Marzano instructional strategies: Learning Goals and Scales, Active Engagement and Participation, Focus on Critical Content, and Tracking Student Progress.

SUPERINTENDENT'S Superintendent Matthew Miller shared that during the legislative lame duck session, action on MPSERS (Michigan Public School Employee Retirement System) reform did not take place as was mentioned last month. It will likely be on their agenda next session.
