Domain I - Student Achievement: CCMR Indicators for HS



College Ready

- Score a 3 or higher on at least one AP exam
- Meet TSI criteria (SAT/ACT/TSIA) in reading and mathematics
- Earn college credit in an approved dual credit course
- Earn an associate's degree

Career Ready

- **Earn an industry certification (TEA list)**
- Be admitted to post-secondary industry certification program

Military Ready

- Enlist in the United States Armed Forces

Accountability

- 45% of the Domain I rating comes from the CCMR criteria.
- Graduates must meet at least one of the listed CCMR criteria.

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BOARD GOAL 3 - - PROGRESS MEASURE 1

The total number of District high school students earning an industry-recognized certification will increase by an average of at least 20% annually over the next five years.

- Year 1 (2017) Target – 31 Certifications
- **Year 2 (2018) Target – 37 Certifications**
- Year 3 (2019) Target – 44 Certifications

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BOARD GOAL 3 - - PROGRESS MEASURE 1

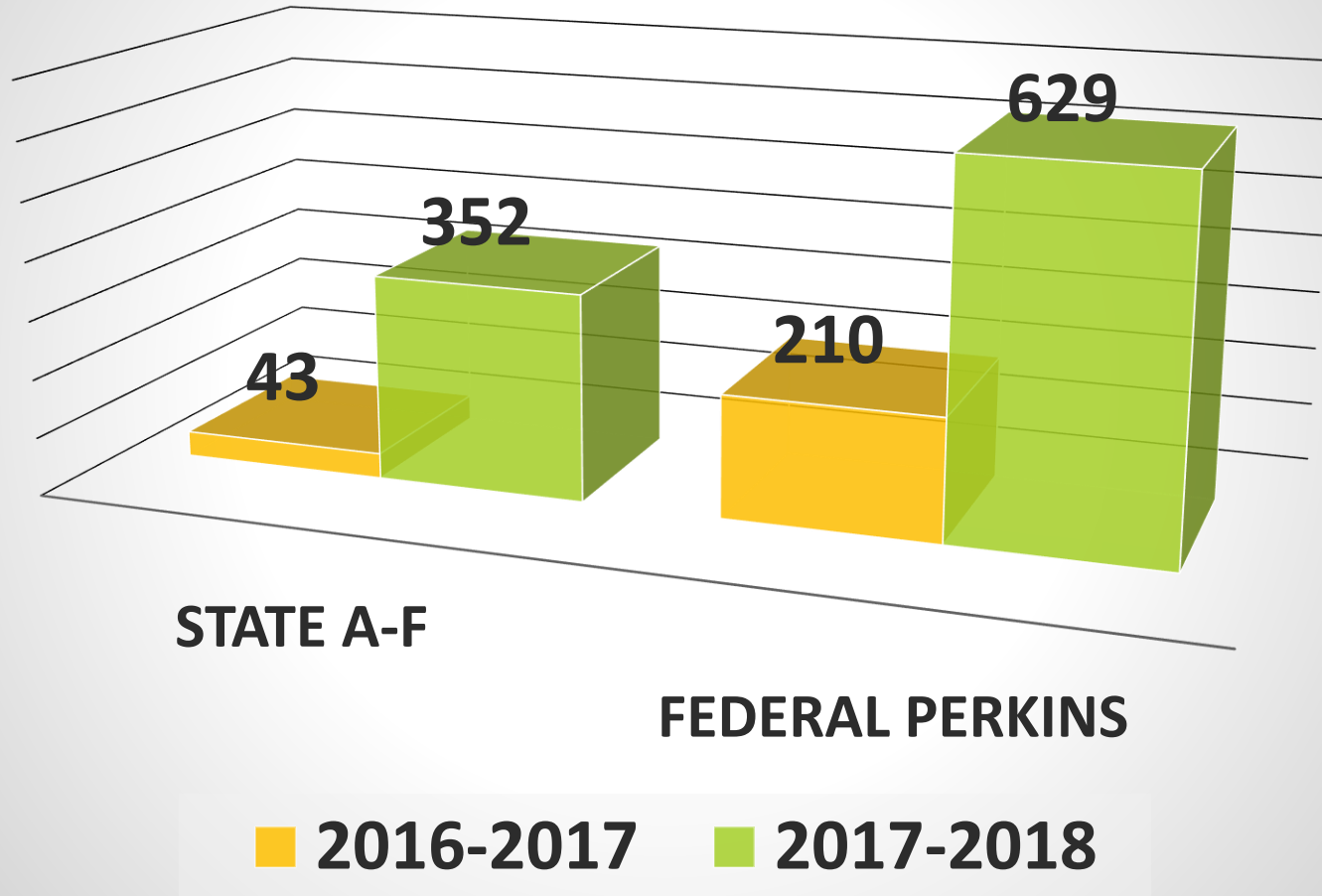
2016-17 Tyler ISD students earned:

- **43** TEA (state) CTE certifications (the goal was 31)
- **200+** Perkins (federal) CTE certifications
- **900+** Combined industry-recognized certifications

2017-18 Tyler ISD students earned:

- **352** TEA (state) CTE certifications (the goal was 37)
- **629** Perkins (federal) certifications
- **1200+** Combined industry-recognized certifications

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BOARD GOAL 3 - - PROGRESS MEASURE 1

2017-2018

- **80% of Tyler ISD high school students participated in a CTE course.**
- **31% of CTE students took at least one certification test.**
- **87% of the students who took a certification test earned at least one certification.**

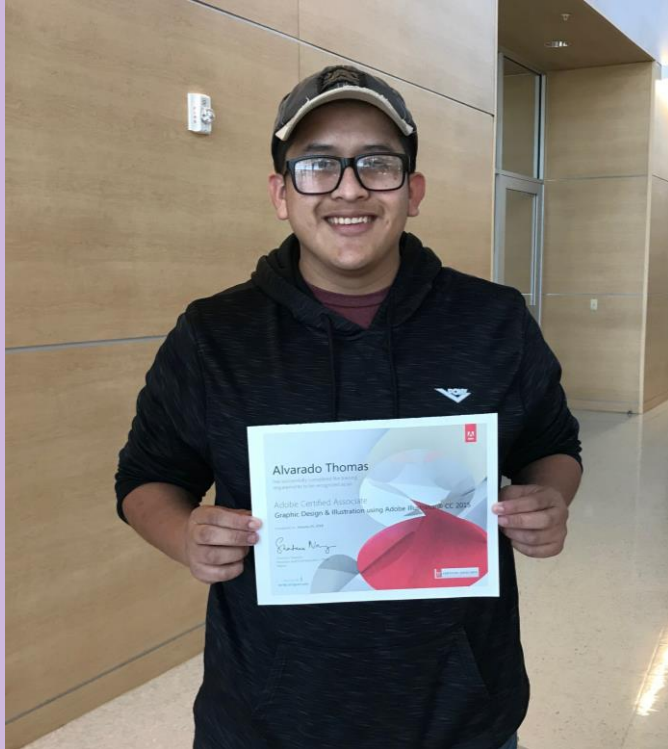
