The National Merit Scholarship Program is an academic competition for recognition and scholarships that began in 1955.



Each year approximately 1.6 million high school students take the Preliminary **SAT/National Merit Scholarship** Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT), which serves as the initial screening for recognition as a National Merit Scholar.



The score attained on the **PSAT/NMSQT** administered during the junior year of high school is utilized to determine Commended Scholars, **Hispanic Scholars, and National Merit Scholar Semifinalists.**



Of the roughly 1.6 million participants, approximately 16,000 (1%) with the highest PSAT/NMSQT scores qualify for recognition as National Merit Semifinalists at the beginning of their senior year of high school.



Following a rigorous application process, approximately 15,000 students are recognized as National **Merit Finalists in February of their** senior year.



Tyler ISD has had one student in each of the past three school years achieve this highest level of recognition of being named a National Merit Scholar.



The following plan of action outlines current and proposed strategies to increase the number of Tyler ISD students who earn recognition in the National Merit Scholarship Program.



FALL 2018

- All 8th graders took the PSAT/8-9.
- All 10th graders took the PSAT/NMSQT.
- All students have access to online test preparation.



- Develop and communicate strategies for increasing college-readiness exam scores and National Merit Scholars.
- Identify teachers who will work with PSAT Team and instruct test-prep courses.
- Extra-curricular pilot test-prep courses offered.



SUMMER 2018

Identified Tyler ISD high school teachers will attend professional learning sessions to be prepared to offer comprehensive test preparation classes and tutorials.



FALL 2019

- All 8th and 9th graders will take the PSAT/8-9.
- All 10th and 11th graders will take the PSAT/NMSQT.
- All students have access to online test preparation.
- After-hours test prep sessions offered.



Sophomores who score in the top 5% from their assigned campus or in the 90%, or higher, National Percentile will be invited to join the TISD PSAT Team. (approximately 65 students)



Top 25 scoring 10th graders in TISD will be recognized as SOAR students.





SCHOLARS OF ACADEMIC RIGOR



Sophomore SOAR students and senior **Commended Students, Hispanic Scholars, and National Merit Scholars** will be recognized formally at a Tyler ISD ceremony.



SUMMER 2020

PSAT Team and SOAR students will be invited to participate in a summer testprep course to maximize their potential for achieving National Merit Scholar recognition based on their Fall 2019 PSAT/NMSQT scores.



FALL 2020

A one-semester local elective course will be offered to 10th-12th graders to support their preparation for success on the PSAT/NMSQT, SAT, ACT, and TSIA.
