WHEREAS, the District is authorized to enter into the Region 11 Education Service Center by executing the Region 11 Education Service Center Master Interlocal Agreement pursuant to the authority granted under Section 271.101 to 271.102 of the Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to participate and join with other governmental entities in the discharge of their respective public and governmental purposes, objectives, needs, programs, functions and services relative to purchasing;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE

Board of Trustees of the Tyler Independent School District, Smith County, Texas:

That the Purchasing/Risk Manager of the Tyler Independent School District under the direction of the Board of Trustees of the Tyler Independent School District is hereby directed and authorized to execute the Region 11 Education Service Center Master Interlocal Agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that execution of this Resolution is conclusive evidence of the Board's approval of this action and of the authority granted herein. The Board warrants that it has, and at the time of this action had, full power and lawful authority to adopt this instrument.

Master Interlocal Agreement (MIA)

This Master Interlocal Agreement ("Agreement") is made by and between Education Service Center Region 11 ("ESC Region 11") and <u>Tyler Independent School District</u> ("Local Government"), (collectively referred to as the "Parties" or individually as the "Party") acting herein by and through their respectively authorized officers or employees.

PREMISES

WHEREAS, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code authorizes local governments to contract with each other to provide governmental functions and services; and

WHEREAS, The Parties wish to enter into this Agreement to provide local governments with greater efficiency and economy in purchasing products and services; and

WHEREAS, the governing bodies of the Parties, individually and together, do hereby adopt and find the foregoing promises as findings of said governing bodies; and

NOW THEREFORE, premises considered, and in consideration of and conditioned upon the mutual covenants and agreements, herein, the Parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. Term: This Agreement is effective from the date of the last signature and shall automatically renew annually unless either party gives sixty (60) days prior written notice of non-renewal.
- Purpose: This Agreement shall: (1) Allow the Local Government to purchase products or services by purchase order, contract, agreement, or other appropriate legal method from ESC Region 11; and (2) Allow the Local Government to join ESC Region 11-sponsored purchasing cooperatives in order to purchase products or services from vendors which have been properly awarded contracts through statutorily authorized methods.
- 3. **Relationship**: The relationship between the Parties is that of Independent Contractor. Neither Party has the authority to bind the other in any manner The Local Government may be required to enter into subsequent contractual arrangements with ESC Region 11 for specific products or services.
- 4. Agreement and Interpretation: The Parties covenant and agree that any litigation relating to this agreement, the terms, and conditions of the agreement will be interpreted according to the laws of the State of Texas and venue shall be exclusively in Tarrant County, Texas.
- 5. Each party paying for the performance of governmental functions or services must make those payments from current revenues available to the paying party.

Subject: Consider Approval of Competitive Sealed Proposals for Lighting at High School Outdoor Athletic Facilities

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In the design of the John Tyler High School and Robert E. Lee High School construction projects, administration had included documents for lighting at the high schools for the baseball, softball and practice fields, as well as the tennis courts. These scopes were not included in the 2017 Bond Guaranteed Maximum Price.

To bring best value to the district, the project was evaluated as an allinclusive high school project separately. Once the project is completed, it will allow much needed flexibility to the long term impact for all athletic programs.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION

As required, plans and specifications were prepared by Thompson Architectural Group and advertisements were issued within the legal timeframe. The proposals were submitted as follows:

Through conservative financial investments, and good fiscal management and interest earned on those investments, Tyler ISD now has the funding available.

WRL has solicited proposal for all work categories to execute new synthetic playing surfaces on all outdoor fields for the high schools along with additional tennis courts for JTHS.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Tyler ISD wants to provide its students with a mobile device to help facilitate learning while both inside and outside of the classroom. The district has provided devices for shared use in the classroom for many years; however, with the onset of Covid-19, it became apparent that it was time to evolve by instituting a 1:1 strategy. This 1:1 initiative will provide a device to most every student in grades K-12.

ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION

The following quotes for student chrome books were evaluated:

Pivot	\$2,860,590
CDW-G	\$3,108,000
Trinity3	\$2,541,000
TIG	\$2,567,790

The Administration reviewed comparable quotes for 3,000 touch chromebooks and 6,000 non-touch chromebooks from various vendors and manufacturers. Ultimately, the decision was made to purchase 9,000 Lenovo chromebooks from Technology Integration Group (TIG) due to a superior warranty and additional services that they could provide. The 9000 units will subsidize the district's current chromebook inventory to provide each student with a mobile device to enhance daily learning.
