# What Should Families Expect When Schools Open in Regards To Health and Safety?

#### **Face Covering Information**

What are the requirements for face coverings for students?



Governor Hutchinson issued an executive order mandating face coverings statewide. Searcy School District Board of Directors voted on Wednesday, July 22, to require face coverings for K-12 students for the 2020-2021 school year. After serious consideration and guidance by the Arkansas Department of Health, the Arkansas Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, and the Centers for Disease Control, the board adopted this emergency policy in order to provide a safer and healthier learning environment for Searcy School District students.

What are the requirements for face coverings for employees?

All Searcy School District employees are required to wear masks or face coverings.



What special measures will be implemented to ensure buildings are clean and sanitized?

Searcy School District custodial and grounds department will continue to take extra precautions regarding sanitizing and cleaning in addition to their everyday normal cleaning procedures. Each individual campus has its own fogger and will be used regularly throughout the day in classrooms and other areas. All classrooms will have disinfectant spray that teachers will spray every time the students leave the classroom.

## Will students have access to water fountains?

Students will need to have their own personal water bottles. Filling stations will be placed throughout the buildings for water filling.



#### **Social Distancing Measures**

How will social distancing be implemented in hallways?	Searcy School District will have decals throughout the hallways indicating which direction students should be going and how far apart to stand. At the secondary level, lockers will not be issued, and every student will carry a school issued chromebook from class to class. Classes may be dismissed at different times for clearer hallways.
How will the lunch/breakfast processes be implemented in order to properly social distance?	Each campus will work out daily rotations where some students eat in the cafeteria, classrooms, or other designated areas. Buildings will implement seating charts in order to keep the same students together throughout the day. Grab and Go meals will be easily accessible for students. Students at the secondary level will place an online order each morning through Nutrislice meal system. Meal cost will be based on meal status such as paid, reduced, or free. Searcy School District Child Nutrition Department encourages families to make payments through <a href="https://www.mypaymentsplus.com">https://www.mypaymentsplus.com</a> , but each campus will have a designated place for meal deposits.
How will social distancing on buses take place?	Bus riders will be required to wear masks. A seating chart will be required, and students will be placed as far from one another as feasible. All students should have their temperature checked at home prior to loading the bus.

How will recess take place?	Students will be dismissed by classroom and assigned to a specific outside area on the campus with the same group of students daily.
What will a student do after arriving at school?	Students will be directed by a school employee to a designated area prior to the start of school.
How will students be dismissed from school?	The building will designate different times for students to be dismissed, so all students are not dismissed at the same time. For example: shuttle riders, daycare riders, car riders, and bus riders will all be dismissed at separate times.
How will bathroom breaks be administered?	A minimum amount of students will be allowed to enter the restrooms at designated times. School employees will monitor the number Elementary classes with built-in bathrooms will follow the same protocol as always. Classroom restrooms will be cleaned during the students' lunch hour.



#### **Illness Protocol**

What measures will be taken to remind students of healthy habits?	Signage will be placed in buildings across the district reminding students to maintain a proper social distance, wash hands regularly, and to wear face coverings when applicable. Teachers/students will participate in regularly scheduled hand washing and sanitizing procedures.
What if a student becomes ill?	Any student who may become ill at school will be sent to the school nurse for evaluation. If a student presents symptoms of Covid-19, he/she will be taken to an isolated location until pickup. All students must be fever-free without the use of fever reducing medication

	for 48 hours prior to returning to school. Searcy School District has also partnered with ARCare who will provide telemed services to Searcy School District staff and students whose parents choose to participate in the services offered by ARCare.
What type of screening is required?	Searcy School District recommends that parents check their child's temperature prior to sending him/her to school. Searcy School District requires that anyone with a temperature of 99.9 or higher should not attend school. Students and adults must screen themselves for respiratory issues such as cough or shortness of breath. Students and adults who experience these symptoms should not attend school.
What if a student tests positive for Covid-19 or is exposed to Covid-19?	Searcy School District will follow the Response Levels of Onsite Learning process that is provided by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), which may be found at the following link: RESPONSE LEVELS FOR ON-SITE LEARNING



### **Visitor Policy**

How will visitors to the campuses be limited?	Any visitor must call the building office before entering and must have essential business. The Searcy School District onsite volunteer program will be suspended during this time.
May I eat lunch with my child?	No. At this time, we will not have visitors for lunch.

# What Should Families Expect When Schools Open in Regards To Instruction?



#### **First Day of School**

School is scheduled to begin on **Monday**, **August 24th**. This date will only change if the Arkansas Department of Health and Governor Asa Hutchinson send updated guidance. Registration is currently open and may be found at searcyschools.org.



#### **Traditional/Blended Learning**

Students who participate in the traditional/blended learning option will attend school onsite and receive face-to-face instruction and assistance in the traditional classroom. They will follow a regular schedule for full days of instruction Monday through Friday. Students will receive district issued Chromebooks as needed and will be prepared to seamlessly pivot to instruction delivered virtually through Google Classroom should they be absent for a limited time because of illness or other legitimate circumstances or there should be a period of school closure. Virtual lessons provided during these absences will be aligned with the curriculum in the traditional setting so students will be able to complete work and transition back into school without falling behind.



Lions Online Virtual Learning

Lions Online is a digital learning option for students in Grades K-12. This platform is for those students who may not feel comfortable with the traditional setting; however, it may not be the best fit for some, particularly students in K-2 that need emphasis on foundational learning. Curriculum in K-3 will focus on the core subjects with supplemental lessons periodically in activity classes. Using a digital device, students will receive instruction delivered by Searcy School District teachers through Google Classroom. The instruction will follow a much more rigorous and comprehensive curriculum than the AMI lessons that were offered last spring. The curriculum will be comparable with the regular classroom and will mirror the learning expectations in the traditional setting. The instruction may include live interaction between students and teachers, previously recorded teacher lessons, instructional videos, research, and independent activities. Teachers will respond to student questions and provide assistance during scheduled times and interact with students through Google Meets (Hangouts) to monitor progress.

Students who need them will be provided school issued Chromebooks. For the digital platform to be effective, sufficient and consistent broadband internet is needed. To the extent possible, the district will work with families to resolve connectivity issues.

Students who enroll in *Lions Online* should be self-motivated, computer literate, committed, and independent learners. They must be effective communicators and have good time management skills. Even though it is expected that students complete the work themselves, it is essential that students who participate in a full time online program have strong parental support and monitoring of student work and progress.
