Dear North Crawford Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

I hope this letter finds you all doing well and enjoying some time together as a family this summer. The purpose of this letter is to inform everyone of North Crawford's "Return to Learn" plan for reopening school on September 1<sup>st</sup>. I thank you all for your patience and understanding as you have waited to receive this information. We have been working diligently with a committee of staff members since the spring to develop this plan.

Our "Return to Learn" plan has been developed using health and education standards and guidelines developed by many different organizations. Some of the organizations that we have used guidance from include the Centers for Disease Control, the American Academy of Pediatrics, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, local medical providers, and Crawford County Public Health officials. Our plan has been presented to our North Crawford staff for their review and input. This past Monday and Wednesday evenings our administrative team presented our "Return to Learn" plan to our school board. After much discussion, the plan was approved unanimously by the North Crawford School Board.

The primary goal of our plan is the safety and well-being of all of our staff and students, while trying to have students in the building learning face to face as much as possible. This has proven to be a very difficult task, but I believe our "Return to Learn" plan has accomplished both priorities. Our plan has all elementary and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students attending school for face to face instruction four days a week. On Wednesdays, all students will learn from home. Our 7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade students will attend school for face to face instruction two days a week, while learning virtually the other three days. We refer to this model as our Hybrid plan, as students will learn both face to face and at home. Additionally, we recognize there are families who may not desire to send their children to school physically during these uncertain times. We plan to accommodate those requests by creating our own full-time virtual learning program in the district. Those students will still be North Crawford students, but will learn from home full-time using our district's virtual learning program.

Other details of our plan include daily temperature checks before students board the school bus or enter the building. All staff, students, and visitors to the building will be expected to wear face coverings when possible. We will be modifying how we serve breakfast and lunch to students, including deliveries for students learning from home. We will have robust cleaning and sanitizing protocols in place within the building and grounds. Finally, we will have strict protocols in place on how we deal with students or staff who may present COVID-like symptoms or who test positive for the virus.

This letter is meant to provide you with a brief overview of the plan. Attached to this letter is a two-page graphic giving you additional details of the plan that aren't covered in this letter. One side is elementary, the other side is middle/high school. Additionally, our principals will be sending further details in regards to the instructional programs, as well as specifics with other aspects of the reopening plan.

Again, thank you all for your patience and understanding as we all work together through these challenging times. I look forward to seeing all of our staff and students later this summer. 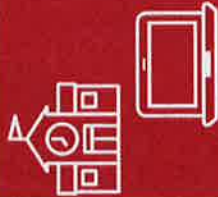

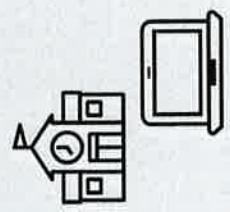

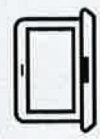
### Hybrid Model
