Remote and Blended Remote Learning Day Plan
Fall 2020 School Reopening Plan
July 22, 2020**

This is not a final plan and may change depending on guidance from the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE), Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), the Lee County Health Department, the Center for Disease Control, and local virus conditions.

Academics

There will be two learning options to choose from, either in-person instruction or remote learning. The parent survey indicated a need for both. We will be asking you at registration to make a choice for your child(ren) regarding either in-person learning or remote learning for the first semester of the school year.

Grading: Both learning options will be using a traditional grading scale, and all students will be required to adhere to the specified due dates.

Attendance:

- **In-Person Instruction:** Students will attend 5 days a week for 5-hours day from 8:00 am – 1:45 pm.
- **Remote Learning Instruction:** A teacher will be designated for remote learning. Subject matter content will be the same as those enrolled for in-person instruction. Remote learning students will need to participate in the daily activities assigned to be marked as present.

Transportation: Assigned seats with as much social distancing as possible, masks must be worn, siblings will be asked to sit together, disinfecting of buses will occur on an ongoing basis, temperature/symptom checks will occur before entering the bus.

Governor's Executive Order Requirements

The Governor's Executive Order 2020-44 created the following list of requirements for districts to have in-person instruction.

Face covering: All students and staff must comply with the face mask requirement unless there is a verified medical condition that prevents them from wearing one. Any student refusing to wear a mask will be transitioned to remote learning. Visitors will be required to wear face coverings and will only be allowed in the Main Office.

Social Distancing: Prohibit more than 50 individuals from gathering in one space. Each building will implement appropriate social distancing requirements.

Schoolwide Cleaning: Increased schoolwide cleaning and disinfection will occur on a frequent basis.

Symptom Screenings and Temperature Checks: Requires symptom screenings and temperature checks or require that individuals self-certify that they are free of symptoms before entering school buildings or boarding a bus. Students, parents, staff, and visitors will complete a self-certification and verification of symptoms form prior to entering the building.

Illness Guidelines

COVID-19 Symptoms include fever at or above 100.4 degrees, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, fatigue, muscle and body aches, headache, sore throat, a new loss of taste or smell, congestion or runny nose, nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea.

- If a student or staff member is sick, they need to STAY HOME.
- If a student or staff member becomes ill at school, they will be referred to the nurse who will contact the parents of the student and the health department regarding the symptoms. The Department of Public Health will make the determination about the teacher and the other students in the class and when the student or staff member can return to school.
- The symptoms listed by the CDC are common symptoms that are present during the school year.
