




#### Which school(s) are you associated with?




#### Do you have sufficient internet access at home?


# Which best describes your CURRENT employment situation? 366 responses

If students return to school in September, would that improve your employment situation or your availability to improve your employment situation?




I believe in-person school should resume as normal, in September, with some new procedures to reduce the spread of the illness.


I believe in-person school should resume in September, with half of the students attending school on any given day and the other half of the students virtually learning from home.


I believe school should not resume in September and all students should continue using distant learning technologies until a vaccine becomes available.

- Stakeholder meetings/OneNote/emails/phone calls
- Staff on campus to begin
- E-learning available for all—structured schedule with multiple options for families to get ELA/Math/Science & Social Studies daily
  - Clear expectations & accountability
- Bring as many students back as possible, based on safety and parent desire
- Have all students start online for the 1st-2nd week of school
  - Slowly transition students into a hybrid model starting with the older grade levels
- Hybrid
  - Child would receive in-person instruction and e-learning
  - Child would remain in family cohort for the time they are in the building
  - Multiple classrooms have their own restroom

#### Transportation

- Determine students returning in person
- Schedule runs based on # of students, locations and final destinations
- Delivery of instructional materials for those who are unable to connect to eLearning environments.

#### Food Services

- Determine # of students returning
- Locations of food services within buildings
- Protocols for delivery of meals to students in eLearning environments at specific locations
- Investigate options for serving eLearning students
  - Daily/Weekly?
