

Emergency Instructional Time Template

Section 520.1

As <u>communicated to chief school administrators on July 6, 2020</u>, Section 520.1 of the School Code provides flexibility to meet minimum instructional time requirements in the event of an emergency that prevents a school entity from providing for the attendance of all pupils or usual hours of classes at the school entity. The Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) considers the World Health Organization-declared Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) a global pandemic and an emergency as contemplated by Section 520.1.

A local education agency (LEA) that elects to implement temporary provisions in response to the COVID-19 global pandemic may meet the minimum 180 days of instruction and 900 hours of instruction at the elementary level and 990 hours of instruction at the secondary level through a combination of face-to-face and remote instruction, consistent with the requirements outlined in PDE's July 6 guidance. Such LEAs must provide PDE with the following information:

Our remote delivery will be planned accordingly to student grade level and needs. Grades 7-12 will attend their classes following their daily schedule and participate in their classes through online formats. Classes will be recorded to allow students who are not able to participate at that time to at least watch the class at a later time. Grades 4-6 will have a modified school schedule to follow, but will be similar to the grades 7-12 format. Grades K-3 will have daily sessions online for the core subject areas.

For those families without internet access at ome, but access to public hot spots work will be formatted to allow for remote download and the ability to ork offline. If no internet access is viable, the district is looking at various solutions through providing dividual Wi-Fi hot spots to families.

√	The proposed school calendar and academic schedule(s) provide at least 900 hours (elementary) and 990 hours (secondary) of in-person instruction and/or remote learning for all students. (Such time may include synchronous and/or asynchronous instruction.)
√	The proposed school calendar and academic schedule(s) define instructional time for students as time in the school day devoted to instruction and instructional activities under the direction of certified school employees. (Such time may include synchronous and/or asynchronous instructional activities.)
√	Clearly defined systems for tracking attendance and instructional time will be implemented to ensure student engagement in remote instruction.

Attachment A - Day and Hour Accounting

In class attendance, as per the district calendar, instruction begins on August 26, 2020 and concludes on June 3, 2021 providing for 180 days of instruction.

When we are in face to face instruction the following hours are being met:

<u>Elementary School</u>: Student day begins at 8:50 am and concludes at 3:30 pm for a total of 6 hours and 40 minutes. Less lunch (30 minutes) and recess (20 minutes), the students near 5 hours and 50 minutes daily. If in session each of the 180 days students would accumulate up to 1050 hours, exceeding the 900 hour minimum.

<u>Secondary School</u>: The students are scheduled for nine 40 minutes classes, or a total of 6 hours of daily instruction. If in session each of the 180 days students would accumulate 1080 hours, exceeding the 990 hour minimum.

When we will be providing remote or virtual instruction the following will be met:

<u>Elementary School</u>: The minimum daily hour requirement is 5 hours per day to meet the 900 hours. Teachers will plan to deliver between online instruction and planned work for the students, a minimum of 5 hours daily. Students will be required to participate in class and/or complete assignments on a daily basis to be considered present within the class.

<u>Secondary School</u>: The students will be expected to follow their schedule remotely and will be provide the same amount of instructional time through online and virtual platforms as if they were in the classroom. Students will be required to participate in class and/or complete assignments on a daily basis to be considered present within the class.

At all times students with IEP's or other learning needs will be provided modifications and adaptations as needed to meet their individual needs.
