



INSTRUCTIONS for MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION at GUY-PERKINS SCHOOL DISTRICT

Parent/Guardians;

If your child will require any medication during school hours, the MEDICATION RELEASE FORM must be filled out completely and signed by the ORDERING DOCTOR. Over the Counter (OTC) medication does not require a prescription from the doctor, but the Medication Release Form must be signed by a Doctor.

All medication is required to be in a prescription labeled bottle and must be dated after July 1, of the new school year. If your child will require Over the Counter medications here are the steps to take to obtain a prescription labeled bottle.

1. Medication Release Form must be signed by your child's doctor.
2. Go to your pharmacy.
3. Purchase the Over the Counter medication, (ex. Tylenol (Acetaminophen), Motrin (Ibuprofen), Benadryl (Diphenhydramine), Tums (Calcium Carbonate, ext) your child will need to take during school hours.
4. Take OTC medication to the Pharmacy Counter and ask the Pharmacist to label the medication with your child's:
 1. Name
 2. Date of Birth
 3. Dosage
 4. Route of Administration
 5. Time of Medication Administration
5. Medication and Form must be brought to the school by parents/guardians. Students are not allowed to bring medication to the school nurse.

Please Note

A NEW MEDICATION RELEASE FORM SIGNED BY THE PARENTS AND DOCTOR MUST ACCOMPANY ANY MEDICATION. NO MEDICATION FROM PREVIOUS YEAR WILL BE ADMINISTERED. ANY PREVIOUS YEAR MEDICATION, IF NOT PICKED UP BY PARENT OR GUARDIANS, WILL BE DISPOSED OF PROPERLY BY JULY 1st.

NO MEDICATION will be administered by the school nurse without the required form and appropriately labeled medication, as it is mandated by Arkansas State Law for medication administration in schools.
