



School Meal Policy

Application for Free and Reduced Price Meals

All families are encouraged to apply for free and reduced meals each year. Families must submit a new application every school year. Families can at any time submit a new application if there is a change in the household income or family number during the school year.

Paper applications are also available in the office or can be downloaded from our website.

Charge Policy

Families are expected to provide money for student meals on a regular and consistent basis unless they qualify for free meals. Parents who have a child with a negative balance will be called to make a prompt payment.

Student Pricing

- Students who do not qualify for free or reduced price meals must pay \$1.75 for breakfast and \$3.05 for lunch
- Students who qualify for reduced meals will be charged \$0.30 for breakfast and \$0.40 for lunch

Payment Options

- Parents are required to make payments in advance so as not to incur a negative balance.
- Students will be notified of a low balance at the register on a daily basis.

Nondiscrimination Statement
