With stricter cleaning and safety protocols, social distancing to the extent feasible, and required cloth masks/shields, I would send my student to school this fall.



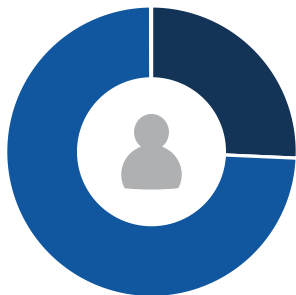

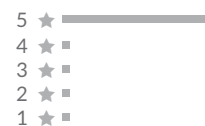
I don't think we should wear face masks from 7am-2:30pm I have asthma and it can give me an asthma attack because I'm not getting the amount of air I need to breathe
