Mission Statement

To keep in line with the latest guidance and direction from the Arkansas Department of Health (ADH) and Division of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) we will start the school year with restricted visitation to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. We will continue our commitment to assist families with parenting resources, communicate about school programs and student progress, recruit family volunteers, involve families with learning activities at home, include families in school decision-making, and collaborate with the community to coordinate resources and services by utilizing technology to provide timely communication, connecting students, teachers, administrators, parents, and patrons. Visitor restrictions will be evaluated on an ongoing basis under the guidance of experts and in consultation with state and city public health officials. Jointly Developed

The Paragould Primary welcomes parent/family participation in the education of their children. Research has shown that parent involvement results in increased student success, increased parent and teacher satisfaction, and overall improvement in the school climate. Our School, Parent, and Family Engagement Plan outlines a variety of opportunities for parents and families to be involved and informed in their child's education.

- Parent representation on Home/School Collaboration Professional Learning Team
 - School improvement teams will set the direction that the school takes based on the overall district vision and specific needs established at the school. The teams will include various stakeholders that represent the interests of Paragould Primary School. These stakeholders' input will provide guidance for school improvement. The purpose of parent participation on advisory committees is to maintain open lines of communication between parents, community leaders, staff, and administration.  - The Home/School Collaboration Committee will conduct an annual review of the effectiveness of the school parental involvement policy as well as the School, Parent, and Family Engagement Plan. In addition, the committee will be given the opportunity to analyze parent survey data collected at the beginning of the year, evaluate effectiveness of existing programs and activities, and make recommendations for improvement regarding the parental involvement policy as well as the School, Parent, and Family Engagement Plan. Parent Center

• Informational Packets

- Information packets are sent home at the beginning of the year. These packets contain the district parental community involvement policy, school parental community involvement policy, a survey for volunteer interests, recommended roles for parents/teachers/students and school, suggestions of ways parents can become involved in their child's education, the school calendar of events that includes parental involvement activities planned for the year, information regarding the systems that will be used to allow parents and teachers to communicate, parent/teacher conference dates, telephone numbers, website information, and information related to the parent resource center.
- Postcards are sent home to each child and his or her family before school starts.
 - At the beginning of each school year, teachers at the Paragould Primary will send postcards to the students that will be in their classroom. The postcards provide parents with background information regarding the teacher as well as information related to the first Parent Involvement Meeting scheduled the week before school starts

• School-Parent Compact

The School-Parent Compact will be jointly developed with parents and school staff. • Home/School Collaboration

 Parents on our Home/School Collaboration Committee take part in the planning and implementation of our family engagement events, such as our Literacy Nights and our Math night. They help to decide on the distribution of Title I funds needed for each event.

• School-Parent Compact

- At our initial School-Parent Compact meeting, the parent facilitator Mrs. Amy Castleberry, reviews the items available to parents in our Parent Center. Parents are then invited to request or suggest additional materials needed.
- During our 2nd School-Parent Compact, scheduled for January 21, 2020, parents are invited to discuss how Title I funds are allocated.

Coordination of Services

- Literacy and Math Nights
 - Literacy Night(s) will be scheduled throughout the year to provide instruction to parents on how to incorporate developmentally appropriate learning activities in the home environment. This training may include activities such as demonstrations from the Paragould Primary faculty, a Brian Kinder story book concert, and representatives from the community demonstrating ways to embrace literacy at home. In addition to Literacy Night events, the Paragould Primary faculty and staff are committed to providing other activities, as deemed necessary, to help a parent assist in his or her child's learning.
 - A Math Night will be scheduled to provide instruction to parents on how to incorporate developmentally appropriate learning activities in the home environment. As part of our Math Night celebration, the Paragould Primary will integrate student art projects into the evening activities. The math training may include demonstrations from the Paragould Primary faculty and family-centered games. In addition to Math Night activities, the Paragould Primary faculty and staff are committed to providing other activities, as deemed necessary, to help a parent assist in his or her child's learning.

• Parent Resource Center

The purpose of this resource center is to make up-to-date parenting information, such as parenting books and magazines, available to interested persons. Handouts and informational materials from local community organizations are also available. Our parent resource center is filled with tools to assist parents as they work to help their child succeed. Items may be borrowed at no cost to parents.

• Partners in Education

Our school has partnered with various businesses within our community to
provide students with further enrichment opportunities and resources. Our current
Partners in Education are Families, Inc, First National Bank, The Greenbrier
Companies, Inc, and the Junior Auxiliary of Paragould.

Building Capacity of Parents

• The First Parent Involvement Meeting (formerly referred to as Open House)

- This event allows parents to get an overall view of expectations throughout the year by both the principal and the classroom teacher. Our program will begin with a presentation in the gymnasium. After the presentation, parents will be able to meet the classroom teacher. After meeting the classroom teacher parents are free to tour other areas in the school including the library, art room, and music room.
- Report cards sent home at the end of each quarter.
 - Report cards are given at the end of each week following the completion of each nine weeks marking period. Students are expected to take their report cards home and give them to their parents who sign and return them to the teacher.
- Parent / Teacher Conferences, September 17, 2020: 1:00-7:00 pm, and February 11, 2021: 1:00-7:00 pm.
 - Parent teacher conferences allow for yet another way for parents and teachers to form an important partnership. Parents are strongly encouraged to visit the school and schedule additional conferences (in person, via phone, or online) as needed.
 During our conferences, faculty will discuss students' current academic progress, state assessment scores, and interpretation of those scores.
 - The school's process for resolving parental conflict is contained in the parent-student handbook.

Seminars

 Seminars will be conducted to inform parents of students about how to be involved in decisions, to provide instruction to parents on how to incorporate developmentally appropriate learning activities in the home environment, and to engage in activities to help parents assist in their child's learning.
