
Director(s) Absent: None.

<b>CALL TO ORDER</b>	Chair Huttie called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.
<b>2017-18 UPDATES SCHOOL SAFETY PRESENTATION</b>	Superintendent Lotze, Principal Greg Goodnight, and POC Sheriff, Alan Botzheim presented on a recent safety concern at Selkirk High School and then responded to questions and answers on school safety from board members, community members, parents, and students. Parents requested that the district develop a process to expedite the delivery of information to parents, even in non-emergency situations. Superintendent Lotze indicated that staff would redouble efforts to acquire parent cell numbers and emails in March during parent/teacher conferences. The information would be used to deploy an “opt-in” text message option for parents as well as a district-wide email deployment. The district currently has an emergency communication system that can be modified with the new information.
<b>CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES WEEK</b>	Superintendent Lotze and Principal Goodnight thanked board members for bringing baked treats and writing thank you notes to classified employees in recognition of Classified Employees’ Week.
<b>4 DAY SCHOOL WEEK- PUBLIC MEETING</b>	Superintendent Lotze presented “4-Day School Week by the Numbers” which outlined the progress toward the goals outlined in the district’s original 180-day waiver application to the State Board of Education dated March 2017. The audience included board members, parents, community members, staff, and students. All were encouraged to complete a survey providing the school board with feedback on whether they supported continuation of the 4-day school week for 2018-19. The survey data will be compiled and available at the regular monthly board meeting on March 26.
